The desired outcome is that the church will function more effectively and efficiently. Being effective as a church means having a framework that is strong enough to respond to our mission and vision.


Grace is presently embarking on the path of structural renewal and surely we need the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

Raising Balanced Kids





When I was approached by FamilyLife@Grace to write this article on 'Raising Balanced Kids', one question that came to my mind was: What can a parent do to raise a balanced kid? 'Raising a balanced kid' can be a subjective matter as it varies according to individual's parenting style, and the expectations that an individual may have on his or her child. Besides deciding what "balanced" would mean, the first thing parents can start with is to consider how they, as parents. have been managing their own sense of balance in life, as well their own mental well being. There are many cases of families I have counselled where parents download their own (emotional) stress on the child, and some with unrealistic expectations too. Subconsciously, some of them have their own unfulfilled dreams and desires that they project upon their

Too often these embedded issues create unnecessary tension in the parent-child relationship, as observed in many of my therapy sessions. Once, I have an emotionally intense therapy session with a mother and her teen of 17 years old who has been pressurized by his parents to perform academically since young. He finally spoke out in anguish to his mother that he had been pressurized by their demands. That outburst brought a revelation to both distraught parents, who till then, has been assuming that he was always coping and doing well. He has been fed with enrichment class after enrichment class, until he finally decided to totally rebel so as to break away from his parents' demands. He ended up joining secret society and got his body tattooed.

Balanced parents are more likely to raise balanced children. The first thing to bear in mind for us as parents is to check our own sense of balance in life.

Secondly, to 'raise a balanced kid', you need to know the strengths of your child. Take time to cultivate and develop their strengths rather than just focusing on what they are weak at. I can't agree more with my elder daughter's kindergarten teacher, who is a faithful follower of Christ, when she told us that it is important to cultivate our children's gifting so that in return, they can serve God and enjoy the talent and strength that they have been given. We, who are God's purposeful creation, are here to use the gifts and strengths that God has given to fulfill that unique purpose. When we are not, it is hard to stay balanced.

Thirdly, in order to have 'a balanced kid', the child needs to learn to find this balance himself. I have been teaching my young daughters how to scoot and roller blade. I can tell them how to balance themselves theoretically and even show them how to do it. I can support them when they are about to lose balance but if I continue to do this every time they are on the scooter or blades, they will never learn to balance themselves. After I have taught them the basics and ensured that they know how to fall so that they will not be seriously hurt, I will need to stand aside and give them the time and space to practise on their own. Only then, can they find their sense of balance.

Lastly, we should, like all good Christian parents, direct our children to God in whom we find our balance. God knows when we are out of balance and He is the one who can help us find our sense of balance in Him.

Likewise, our children should learn that they can run to Jesus when "their burden becomes heavy".

or ipad?

Dad is answering a colleague's e-mail on his iPhone. Mum is texting to her friend, on her own iPhone. Junio is completing his homework on his iPad, and his little sister is plugged into Britney Spears on her iPod. The perfect iFamily? No, this is not a commercial from Steve Jobs' Apple, but a common sight in Singapore restaurants on weekends. It may be family time, but the family members are not talking with one another; instead they are peering into their separate screens. If such wired families behave like that in restaurants, you can be sure they do the same at home. Increasingly, electronic gadgets are changing the way families interact. Most homes now have one or more computers. In a survey carried out by Nielsen for the Digital Consumer Report in June and July this year, nearly one in four, out of the slightly more than 1,000 surveyed, said they had a tablet computer in the household. Seventy per cent of those surveyed used smartphones. But not interacting during family time has harmful effects. Psychiatrist Adrian Wang reported that he received one or two complaints a month from parents who said electronic gadgets were distracting their children and that they did not know how to communicate any more. Counsellor Tammy Fontana from All in the Family Counselling said children also complained that parents were never really 'present'. Family time is face-to-face (F2F) time, and especially among Singapore families where both parents work and are often hurried, it is precious down-time. Parents should lay down the rule that no one should be using electronic gadgets at the dinner table. The adults should also set an example by not attending to e-mail or text messages when the family gathers for a meal. Parents and children should be 'present' for one another, and interact fully as a family - The Sunday Times Sep 11, 2011

While the world is trapped and caged by the latest gadgets, what are the founders, technology chief executives and venture capitalists of these gadgets saying?

"So, your kids must love the iPad?" I asked Mr. Steve Jobs. The company's first tablet was just hitting the shelves. "They haven't used it," he told me. "We limit how much technology our kids use at home."

"Every evening Steve made a point of having dinner at the big long table in their kitchen, discussing books and history and a variety of things," he said. "No one ever pulled out an iPad or computer. The kids did not seem addicted at all to devices" - Walter Isaacson, the author of "Steve Jobs." who spent a lot of time at their home.

Evan Williams, a founder of Blogger, Twitter and Medium, and his wife, Sara Williams, said that in lieu of iPads, their two young boys have hundreds of books (yes, physical ones) that they can pick up and read anytime.

Chris Anderson, the former editor of Wired and now chief executive of 3D Robotics, a drone maker, has instituted time limits and parental controls on every device in his home. "My kids accuse me and my wife of being fascists and overly concerned about tech, and they say that none of their friends have the same rules," he said of his five children, 6 to 17. "That's because we have seen the dangers of technology first-hand. I've seen it in myself, I don't want to see that happen to my kids."

Alex Constantinople, the chief executive of the OutCast Agency, a tech-focused communications and marketing firm, said her youngest son, who is 5, is never allowed to use gadgets during the week, and her older children. 10 to 13, are allowed only 30 minutes a day on school nights.

Ali Partovi, a founder of iLike and adviser to Facebook, Dropbox and Zappos, said there should be a strong distinction between time spent "consuming," like watching YouTube or playing video games, and time spent "creating" on screens.


When we were at the slum we had to walk along the slippery and narrow mud tracks. It was an eye opener for me!

Constructed with wood and bricks, the houses are simple, dim and without much furniture. Yet, the children shone brightly in the plain, unsophisticated home where all of them gathered for the feeding program. Before we share our stories and songs, the older kids led worship. It is hard to forget their childlike, earnest and sincere voices. We danced along with them in the worship. We definitely felt blessed. I

felt all my burdens of stress and worries disappeared. A sense of freedom rose within me to worship the Lord just like these little ones.

The children paid full attention while Jasline, a fellow tripper, shared an animated story of a lost kite and its owner; akin to the lost and Jesus. Some of our eyes almost swelled with tears when many children raised up their hands instantaneously when she asked how many of them wants the love of Jesus. Praise the Lord for moving their hearts.

PS WAI CHING

Hi, I am Pastor Wai Ching. My family and I have been worshipping in Grace Assembly since 1973. I am the youngest of 5 children. Members of Grace Assembly came to witness to my brother and sister when we were staying at Mei Ling Street. We started attending sunday school and not long later my mother also became a Christian. One by one, the rest of my family came to know Christ and today, my household and I serve the Lord.

Although our home then was not accessible by public transport, we tried to attend the prayer meetings in the church. We could not afford tithes but my mother would give food to the pastors and bring fruits to the church grown at our back yard. Some of my fondest memories were carolers at my home during Christmas.

I worked as a secondary school teacher teaching music and English. That was one of the most fulfilling season of my life as I enjoyed teaching and reaching out to my choir students and colleagues. However, the Lord moved me into a season of cross-cultural mission work. The preparatory stage at Youth With a Mission –School of Biblical Studies and the Assemblies of God Bible College (AGBC) proved to be invaluable. A good understanding of God's Word helped lay a strong foundation in my Christian development.

I served as a missionary in India for 15 months and I was involved in setting up the Spoken English class with the Assemblies of God church in Puri, India. After graduating from AGBC with a Masters in Theological Studies, I served in East Timor for about 4 and half years and was involved in teaching and church planting work with the Assemblies of God church. I discovered that I had the gift of language and



the Lord directed me to study and gain proficiency in the Tetun language, so that I could teach and preach without an interpreter. In 2010, the Lord led me to return to Singapore to look after my aging parents. Today, I am privileged to be the country director of Cambodia, the pastor-in-charge of Grace Prison Ministry and also the community pastor of GIE region.

I believe God has prepared me for who I am today through the varied experiences in my life. My one desire now is to partner with the Holy Spirit, to share the gospel and make disciples, who will in turn evangelize and disciple others. The Lord has opened a wide door for me to teach and preach the Word of God on the mission field, in the prison chapel services and at Grace Group meetings. The Lord has also laid a burden on the hearts of our Grace Prison Ministry volunteers to set up the After Care Integration Program (AIP) to help 'returning' brothers and sisters from prison, integrate into the body of Christ, and be restored to their families and to the society. My prayer is that our church members will receive them into the body of Christ and disciple them to follow Christ, for the Lord Jesus came to seek and save the lost.
