



For this month, let's lift up our church's leadership transition in prayer:


- 1. Pray for the Father's constant presence in the church throughout this season of leadership transition.



The Prayer Of A Desperate Parent Series

THE GOSPEL OF CHRIST VS. THE FEEL-GOOD CULT

Christianity was really popular when I was little. People used to think Christians are saints living by a higher moral conduct.

But this has rapidly declined in the past decade. Today, Christians are seen as an exclusive and self-serving violators of human rights. The Bible says that homosexuality is sin to a world fighting for the right to choose one's gender outside of birth. It also says that Jesus is the only way to God and to a world championing inclusivity of religion and equal merits for all beliefs.

Persecution will come (John 16:33). That's not what scares me. What scares me is how Christians around the world are starting to adopt a politically-correct religious leaning – a feel-good cult of compromises.

Sociologists Christian Smith and Melinda Lundquist Denton coined the term 'Moralistic Therapeutic Deism' after interviewing 3,000 teenagers across America*. They discovered that many of today's youths view Christianity across three highly compromised core beliefs.

And whether we like it or not, these views are seeping into our world through the Internet and the media to redefine Christianity in an erroneous way to our kids.

So today, I'm addressing these three false beliefs that we, as parents, have to help our kids become aware of and protect themselves against these mentally, emotionally and spiritually.

FALSE BELIEF 1. God wants people to be nice and fair to one another.

Jesus was not 'nice'. He was kind, yes. But He cared about righteousness. He spoke up for the truth. Freedom of speech, freedom of voice, freedom of choice, freedom to be—all these need to be looked at through the lens of Biblical truth. Jesus said in John 8:32, 'You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.'

The second half of this scripture cannot exist without the first—know the truth. In John 14:16, Jesus refers to Himself as the truth. So, outside of who Jesus is and what He says, there is no truth, no real freedom.

In John 2, Jesus flipped cages and overturned money-lending tables to enforce God's truth. When He healed people, He often followed it up with, 'Go and sin

> This is one of our constant battles at home. The kids are getting older and they throw 'Christianity' at Colin and me regularly to get their way. We often hear, "Mum, Jesus wants you to show love and be nice to me." I've turned around and told him so many times, "In this instance, correcting you is how I am showing you love. Disobeying God's commandments has consequences and I need you to understand that." I also need my kids to understand that under no circumstances should we compromise on our

Biblical beliefs to 'play nice'.

FALSE BELIEF 2. The central goal of life is to be happy and to feel good about

No! The central goal of our existence is to know God, bring Him honour by understanding His purpose for our lives and fulfilling it. Psalm 78:7 says, 'Every generation must discover God's purpose for them, so they can set their hopes anew in God.'

"Mom, should I get a job that ensures an easy life?" I looked at Daniel as those words left his lips. Then I laughed<mark>. My husband laughed too. Because if you</mark> know me, I am a world-class multi-tasker—holding a full-time job, giving talks, blogging, writing, parenting, serving in Church and more.

Now, don't get me wrong. It's not about how many things you do. And I don't do them because they're easy or hard. I do them because God has deposited in me gifts—presents that only I have. And to use them brings me joy and fulfilment, and it helps me be a positive contributor and brings my Father pleasure.

I know what Daniel loves doing—he does it all the time at home. Building, inventing, drawing designs, making models and testing prototypes. He's brilliant at that, and the piano too. But the last thing I want is for either of my kids to think they need a job because of the money. I don't want them quitting on things either, just because they're hard.

Jesus' destiny was to die on the cross for our sins. If you think life is hard, think about that for a moment.

We live in a society where we want instant gratification and be satiated at a finger's snap. But the pleasure of that vanishes quickly.

Let's help our kids endure what life throws at them and be willing to put their lives through the Refiner's fire to become God's versions of themselves.

FALSE BELIEF 3. Good people go to heaven when they die.

Now this seems to be the most popular religion of late. And many pastors in America have adopted universalism and are preaching this.

Let's not be deceived. John 14:5-6 says that Jesus is the only way to God. Does this make us an exclusive club? No, it doesn't. In John 6:37, Jesus says, 'Whoever comes to me I will never drive away.

If anything, I think being good is a harder way to gain redemption than having our sins forgiven by grace.

My pre-believing friends know my stand. I don't judge their lack of belief. I show love, kindness and offer to pray for them in their times of need. And then I preach Christ.

Our kids are taught to do the same. Two weeks back, Sarah, my eight-year-old, told her friend, Sadia, about Jesus. Then, she asked Sadia, "Do you believe in Jesus?" Sadia replied, "Yes, He's like all the other gods." Then, Sarah turned and told her, "No. There is only one true God. It's Jesus."

Sarah came home and told me this, and asked me if she had insulted her friend. I said, "No, you spoke what you believe." Of course, I quickly taught her how she could phrase her statement wisely without compromising the truth. To add the words, "I believe there is only one true God. And it's Jesus."

Did Sadia come to know Jesus? Perhaps not immediately. But I'm sure that girl will lie in bed sometime later and think about what Sarah had shared with her. A seed has been sown.

In conclusion, our kids have been blessed with one beautiful life to live. Let's champion them living it for God's glory in accordance with His word and not with the ever-changing ideologies of this world.

Give me Father, a purpose deep, In joy or sorrow Thy word to keep; Faithful and true what e'er the strife, Pleasing Thee in my daily life; Only one life, 'twill soon be past, Only what's done for Christ will last.

UNSUNG HEROES AT THE FRONTLINE: FACES OF REACH COMMUNITY SERVICES

When the phone rings on the general office line, they are the ones who answer. When visitors drop in at our Centres, they are the ones who greet and address their first queries. While many are general enquiries, some are critical life-and-death conversations. RCSS has front-desk operations at our Counselling Centre, Youth cum Senior Centre, and our Family Service Centre (FSC). These are typically manned by our unsung heroes with a client-facing role—our Administrative Executives.

Like the triage nurse at the hospital A&E who makes quick and critical decisions on who gets to be attended to straight away, front desk conversations and decisions are often critical. Someone in severe distress or with a suicide tendency may be calling the centres as a last-ditch attempt. A calm, caring and helpful person receiving the distress call or meeting that distressed enquirer at the door may be that very person who holds out that last ray of hope the client may be reaching for.

But apart from attending to administrative tasks and clients, we know little about an administrative executive's role. Here are some interesting facts from our administrative executives— Maria Tan (M), Jeslyn Chee (J) and Irene Goh (I).

What are your daily tasks, other than attending to hotline enquiries and walk-ins?

- J: My tasks include addressing enquiries by explaining the counselling process before arranging for appointments. I also work closely with the counsellors for case-related admin duties. For every client who enters our Centre, I will make them feel comfortable by offering them a drink as they wait for the counsellor.
- I: Other than taking care of the admin duties of the daily operations, I work closely with the social workers pertaining to FSC casework, like compiling data according to Ministry of Social and Family Development (MSF) requirements.
- M: Apart from admin support, I also attend to the needs of our senior members who participate in our morning activities, as well as assist the youths with drop-in activities such as the loaning of sports equipment.

Any challenging encounters?

J: I encountered unhappy couples who refused to speak to each other as they entered the Centre. To reduce the tension, I would receive them with smiles and offer them a drink. Oftentimes, I am greeted with callers who

- are feeling clueless and desperate. I will offer them a listening ear and encourage them to seek help.
- I: I encountered clients with mental health issues who cursed me over the phone, and I had to continue to handle them in a professional manner. These are the times when I really prayed for God's wisdom for the 'right words' to speak.
- M: The most challenging encounter is to multi-task while attending to the needs of our members, which at times require me to put aside my own tasks and just be a listening ear to them; to show care and concern when they want to share their stories with me.

What is the most fulfilling part of your role?

- J: To see clients walking out of our counselling rooms feeling relieved, wearing a smile of hope after the session. I am also encouraged when they make an effort to return for sessions. I feel fulfilled to be part of this process through my admin support to the counselling team!
- I: Making a difference to the lives around us. Everyone who comes to the FSC basically has a need or needs help or assistance. Being at the front desk means that I will be their first point of contact to bring a smile or glimmer of light to the situation they are facing.
- M: The opportunity to serve the community, be it youths or seniors; to be able to show God's love and care for them. Building good friendships with our clients would leave them feeling loved, valued and blessed by God through REACH.

We want to thank all our front-desk staff for the extra mile they have gone in providing excellent service to every person coming to enquire about services at REACH, and leaving a good impression about us in their minds. Your hard work and invaluable contributions are so important to us.

"I could not get away from this verse for this meeting." Dr John Andrews shared with the crowd of around 600 Gracians at the revival meeting on 16 August at Bethel hall in Grace@Tanglin (GI).

Getting To Know...

When did you first hear the Good News, and who shared it with you? What was your response?

I heard about Jesus when I was in primary school, while going home on the school bus. One of the boys in the bus told me about Jesus and gave me some flyers which illustrated the divide between man and God that only Jesus' sacrifice could bridge. I was troubled by this as it meant that the path that I was on at that time was not the right one, and I could not understand why all paths did not lead to God. For this reason, I promptly dismissed what was being shared. But the words that were shared with me, stayed with me.

When did you decide to give your life to the Lord?

The words that had been shared with me in primary school, especially the fact that Jesus was the one and only way, kept coming back to me during my junior college / army days. I was placed in a scholarship class during my A Levels and I had trouble fitting in. On top of that, my grades started slipping and I was worried that I would not be able to do well for my A Levels. I found myself feeling very anxious about my future and no matter how much I tried, I could not find peace. This restlessness led me to notice that one of my army mates would always be reading his Bible during breaks. I went up to him and shocked him by asking him to hand me the Bible so that I could read it for myself. He gave me his Bible and very nervously told me to start by reading the New Testament. For the next month or so, I read the New Testament. I

not only found a deep sense of peace, but had an overwhelming sense of 'lightness' when reading the Word. I started feeling calmer and Jesus' words such as '[my] peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your heart be troubled, nor let it be afraid' spoke to me. After reading about Jesus' sacrifice and why He went to the cross, I understood what had been shared with me many years before. I now had a choice to make and

I decided to follow Jesus. My army mate led me to say the sinners' prayer. We remain friends till today.

What has your Christian journey been like since? Share any challenges that you have encountered, and also how you have been blessed.

It has not been an easy one but the Lord has been very faithful. I came from a traditional Sikh family and at the time when I became a Christian in the early nineties, it was rare for Punjabis to become Christians. In the early years, it was also difficult for us to go to church, so the church came to us. A pastor from Kuala Lumpur, to whom I had been introduced, went out of his way to nurture my walk in the Lord. As I couldn't go to church, he used to come down to Singapore to meet me at the Pizza Hut in Bukit Timah Plaza

to disciple me in the Word. We would meet on my days off from the army. The Pizza Hut is still there and whenever I walk by it, I cannot help but look in and remember the times we had there. Things definitely improved after I accepted Christ – I found peace and the Lord turned things around for me. I started doing well in my studies again and it was only because of the Lord that I became a lawyer – He made it possible.

In the years that followed after marriage, one of the major hurdles we faced was the lack of a child in our marriage. For more than 10 years of our marriage, we had no children. Then the Lord blessed us with a baby girl and gave us the desires of our hearts.

When did you start attending Grace Assembly, and what do you like or love about this church? What ministries have you been involved in over the years?

We started attending Grace about 15 years ago. Initially, we were just visiting to get a feel of the church. We wanted to keep our visit as low key as possible and tried to enter the church through a side door in the old Grace@Tanglin premises, but Pastor Calvin happened to be standing there that morning and a short while later, he and his wife visited us in our home and the rest is history. It is the warmth of the people in this church that I love the most. Every Sunday, the pastors and the ushers take pains to make all of us feel welcome and I think that on most Sundays, we would have been greeted by no less than five or six people on our way to our seats. This definitely helps to set the tone for the service. I also like the fact that Grace has so many ministries for people to serve in and actively encourages people to do so. The sermon series is also very helpful. The series provides for continuity and gives a clear direction in terms of objectives and takeaways from the series.

In terms of ministries, I served as a cell group leader for more than 10 years, first in Grace and then three years in Khush Khabri Fellowship (KKF), the Punjabi church that worships at Grace@Tanglin (GI). I enjoy leading cells and I think that it is very beneficial to be leading — you have to prepare and to prepare, you have to go through the materials carefully and understand the message. If not, you will not be able to lead. All this means that you have to spend time in the Word, and that only serves to build you up. I have also been on missions trips to Cambodia and Sri Lanka, and I have experienced first-hand the good work that Grace Missions is doing in these places and, no doubt, others.

What was the impetus for your decision to contribute as a member of the Church Board?

Grace is a church that encourages its people to serve and its people do so very willingly, in multiple ways. There are so many people in Grace who serve in multiple ministries, and serving on the Board is no different. I was asked to serve, and if I can contribute, I should do so.

How have your family members been supportive in this area? My family members have been very supportive, and they encouraged me to step forward.

What is your vision for this church?

I agree with the present vision for the church — 'More people, More like Jesus'. I also like the missional family vision that the church is trying to inculcate in all of us. Separately, I like the fact that Grace is a multigenerational, multi-cultural church where people from all walks of life can come and worship Jesus.

Just an observation ...

I don't remember the last time I was asked how and when I became a Christian. Christians rarely ask these questions nowadays and I think that if we did more of this, we would be amazed by the wonderful testimonies we would hear from others about how they were led to the Lord. We should do more of this.


