(A) Why Missional? PURPOSE

We need to understand the theological underpinnings of being missional:

- It's about the missional nature of God (John 3:16)
- It's about actively participating in the missio dei or mission of God (Matthew 28:18-20)
- It's about the incarnational ministry as demonstrated by Jesus (Philippians 2:6-8)

Being missional is a lifestyle where we intentionally live out the gospel wherever we are.

- We are a family of God, brought together as brothers and sisters in Christ. 'Therefore, as we have opportunity, let us do good to all people, especially to those who belong to the family of believers'
- We are a multilingual, multicultural and inter-generational family.
- We believe every family unit is important and has a God-given mission.

(C) Why Missional Family Church? ✓ PRODUCT

A Missional Family Church lives out the church's three dimensional calling:
To be upwardly focused on worshiping God with passion.

- To be inwardly focused on building community among believers that is demonstrated in a relationship of love.
- To be outwardly focused on reaching a world that needs the gospel of Jesus Christ.

In short, as a Missional Family Church, we are 'Gracians who love God and people wherever we



Redeem One Conference: Redefining Redemption



Redeem One Conference, held at GII on 12-14 December, proved to be a prelude to an exciting new chapter in the history of R-AGE. Serving as a primarily preparatory and equipping experience for its 188 delegates, the conference kick-started the Redeem Movement for the ministry, aspiring to be set apart from usual camps and events by its momentum and radical consistency next year.

Through the various messages delivered by R-AGE's youth pastor, Pastor Joey Asher, the R-AGErs were able to unpack the immense meaning of redemption by understanding the 5W1H of redemption, namely:

"What is Redemption?", "Why Redeem?", "Who needs Redemption?", "How can we Redeem?", "Where can we Redeem?" and "When should we Redeem?"

Through these messages, delegates were provided compelling answers to each of these questions. All these plenaries finally arrived at the conclusion that redeeming the forgotten, lost and wandering in our generation is a divine process that we are privileged to partake in, and the redemption process needs to happen right now; anywhere and everywhere.





In addition, we had afternoon master-classes. Various para-church and social service organisations such as Interserve, Habitat for Humanity, Campus Crusade for Christ, Youth With A Mission, Singapore Youth For Christ and our very own Grace Missions, were invited to share and setup booths to encourage delegates to take action and to cement their convictions with tangible participation within these para-church organisations.

Before signing up at the booths, the delegates first heard the representatives from these organisations on their various missions and methods of advancing the Kingdom, by means of a talk-show facilitated by Pastor Joey. This aided delegates in understanding how they could partner in God's work, by meeting tangible needs with these organisations. This broadened their exposure to a myriad of channels, where the delegates could put into action Biblical instruction for redemption, for His glory.

Another major highlight of the conference was "Be a Blessing", where delegates moved out to share God's love to strangers through an organic, dynamic process, and in the process, experienced how obedience also built faith within themselves. After a short message outlining the fact that redemption can take place anywhere and everywhere, delegates were surprised to learn that they could immediately go forth to various parts of Singapore to be blessings.

Cell groups then bought packets of snacks, with accompanying Christmas cards that said, "you are loved." Delegates were to give this card to strangers and simply bless them and tell them they are loved. Delegates were also encouraged to pray for the people they distribute the cards to expose these strangers to God's power in their lives. As the delegates gathered back at the GII Sanctuary two hours later, heartwarming stories of people from all ages receiving acts of love with overwhelming gratitude, began pouring out from each cell.





On the last night of the conference, delegates donned uniforms, even military ones, and flooded the hall as they worshipped, representing the mission fields they all were placed in. The Sanctuary was transformed into a house of prayer that night, as parents and Shepherds anointed and commissioned each and every youth to go forth.

Prayers started from individual level, to focus on families and loved ones yet unsaved, then moved to schools and the organisations delegates were in, and finally, a global prayer for the redemption of nations. In a symbolic act of accountability and faith, delegates each wrote on cards three names of people they wished to redeem for Christ, and deposited them, along with their school crest, into a glass bowl. Each delegate then retrieved randomly a card from this bowl, to keep accountable to one another regarding the redemption of the three names written on the card.

In what seemed like an act of poetic, glorious conclusion, an R-AGEr, Benjamin Png was completely healed of chronic deafness in his left ear on the final night of the conference, after a parent prayed for him. Having had to cope with this disability for years, Benjamin often struggled with the reality of his disability; which also led him to question God's love for him by making him seemingly lesser abled than others. Yet that night, God answered Benjamin's prayers with an astounding healing touch!

Akin to Benjamin's miraculous experience, what marked this conference as a major turning point for the ministry was not its novelty— but its reality. How fitting it was that at the start of the Redeem Movement, God would show His hand through a tangible miracle, as if to redefine redemption, as a real, pressing mission, can only be achieved by His hands and power. We are indeed blessed to partner with God in such an important mission.

R-AGE Revival Service: Full Volume III

I'm Elmer and I serve with the R-AGE youth worship team. 

On 14 November, I went on my first missions trip to Puri India, with 11 amazing individuals. We carried out three ministries- children's programmes, pastors' conferences and healing services.

Pastor Ben shared with us that the place was a jungle 15 years ago. When we witness the development of Puri, it puts into perspective the contribution of missions work. From a place where fishermen resisted sending their children to school, to more than 600 students receiving education now – a testament of God's amazing and continuing work in Puri.



Acts of healing were abound during this trip. I saw a skeletal, bedridden woman rise up and walk for the first time in three years. Another elderly lady, known for not being able to sit, was able to do so after prayed for. A blind and mute woman heard and spoke for the first time in her life. It was incredible seeing the faces of these people filled with gratitude, and hearing the shouts of "Amen!" from the crowds, growing louder with each healing. I was filled with an awe of God's greatness, touched by the crowd's faith, and inspired to take my own leap of faith to pray for more people to be healed!

I also watched as God healed broken hearts and responded to the passionate cries of local leaders in their 'dry seasons' of ministries. They left the pastor's conference refreshed, equipped and ready to continue their ministries in local churches.

The children's programmes were no less exciting. Our team was pushed to rely on God when we were told to organise a programme for 200 children, not knowing the actual number attended was almost 600! Everyone was challenged in different ways, and we can only thank God for pulling us through, using us in ways we never thought possible! I was incredibly impressed by the faith of young children there. Even the most 'rowdy' child would pray earnestly with eyes firmly shut and focused on God!


What a show of God's unfailing love throughout this trip! I am incredibly thankful to have been on the front row seat of this experience. Joyful Hearts Are Good Medicine! 'A joyful heart is good medicine, but a crushed spirit dries up the bones.' – Proverbs 17:22

All glory to God when the Nepal medical team, sent by Grace Missions in October, had a fruitful trip and even appeared on the local news! Hungry to watch the hand of God move among people, seven Gracians teamed up with our Grace Missions partners in Nepal to provide free healthcare support to the locals of Tikapur, a town on the far west of Nepal. Given the town's highland living conditions, its constant exposure to strong UV rays have not been beneficial to the locals, who suffer from malnutrition and lack essential nutrients.







As doctors, medical volunteers, pastors and interpreters served God with eager and joyful hearts, they played crucial roles in making a difference in the lives of the locals. When the local news people heard about the medical camp, journalist Bhuwaneshwore Adhikari expressed his gratitude, "May it be in the name of religion, organization or person, it always sends out a positive message when the local people gets these services." Indeed as the people received healthcare support, the seeds have been sown and the Lord's name will reach the masses. Dr Lawrence Soh, leader of the medical team, shared, "God's hand in the medical camp is shown through the care we give, in a loving caring manner, through counseling and prayer by the local church planters, for those in need and empowering the church leaders in the eyes of the community."

A medical missions trip has revealed God's loving hand upon the people in Nepal and even touched the lives of the medical team. God uses different people from various occupation, most importantly, those with joyful hearts that yearn to serve the Lord!

Pastor Benjamin Wong, pastor in-charge of FamilyLife@Grace shares his heartbeat for the ministry in the new year...

WALK THE TALK WITH US THIS YEAR

This year marked the second year since I took over FamilyLife@Grace. It has been a journey of faith and some sleepless nights...I meant prayer nights. I have been carrying mixed feelings since I started this journey. I am feeling elated and at the same time overwhelmed by the needs in the ministry.

I am elated because God has been showing me His providence and guidance in every step of the journey. It was amazing to see how God has provided the resources when we have to build the ministry from scratch. We have seen God raising workers who are passionate about building and restoring marriages & families. Men and women have stepped out of their comfort zone to serve Him in different ways. Since my early days in the missions field, I have always been familiar with the slow and arduous process of pioneering work. Though every step was a step of faith powered by prayer, we have never been disappointed. God has always proven Himself to be faithful. The growth of the ministry brought about a "snowballing effect" which required more workers and resources in order for the ministry to continue to grow and touch more lives. Mun's driving ...

God has blessed me in both tangible and non-tangible ways last year. I am able to recount many but one that I would like to share is a trivial but precious routine – that is my daily chauffeuring of my daughters to and fro from school.

It started out with a simple prayer to live out Deuteronomy 11:19 where I was reminded to fix the Lord's Word in my heart and mind and to teach the Word to my children, talking about them when I am at home and when I walk along the road, when I lie down and when I get up. I pondered upon the 'creative' ways to get closer to my daughters, especially my eldest one. She is stepping into her pre-teen years and I was concerned how her personality would be moulded as she was beginning to form her own opinions – she is at the season where opinions of friends outweigh those of her parents'. I had also found it especially difficult to engage her in conversations after returning home from school as she would be deluged by mountains of schoolwork while I had to coach the younger daughter, above that I had to take care of the household chores. We would both be

tired out before bed time. This simple routine provided a simple solution of sorts. I finally made the decision to chauffeur my daughters late last year. It was out of the norm as they had been taking the school chartered buses since Nursery 2, an arrangement I preferred as it freed me to do a lot of things. I was deeply convicted of this after hearing sis Michelle shared about how she jealously guarded the time she chauffeured her children to school every morning and I had wondered about it. I now know why.

Every trip we make together, for that duration of time, we are captive audiences to each other, literally! I had to think hard ahead of how to use the time purposefully and subtly weave in topics and stories without appearing too pretentious and deliberate. In the short 15-20 minute car ride, we took to the Lord our prayers and thanksgivings. We asked for God's wisdom and knowledge as well as His guidance to walk in ways
