

As you know, 'Expanding into the World' is our 4th key thrust as a Missional Family Church. The world is getting more uncertain today and it calls for a greater urgency to fulfil the 'missio dei' that God gave to us.

In Grace Missions, we are thankful for your support - be it going, praying or giving. From January to June, we have a total of 47 mission trips to the 11 countries we are involved in. Also a total number of 133 Gracians participated in missions in the first 6 months. In terms of money, we received an amount of \$1.127m. As compared with the budget for 2016, there's a shortage of \$900k. Let's believe that this amount will come in by the end of this year.

One exciting news I want to share is that we are sending a family to Singkawang, Kalimantan as our missionary.

Caleb together with his wife Su-Lin and daughter Keziah will be in Singkawang in the beginning of August.

While he's there, Caleb will :

- supervise our church planting works
- teach at the missions school
- help the local churches
- coordinate the different teams to Kalimantan.

Please pray for Caleb and his family fervently as it's a big step of faith for them and I'm so thankful for their sacrificial love for the Lord.

With a missionary based there, it will enable us to do even more to expand into the world.

May the Lord continue to use every Gracian in these last days to advance His Kingdom.

BIBT726: Kingdom of God Professor: Rev Peter Tsukahira

A Biblical basis for understanding the Kingdom of God from a practical viewpoint that incorporates principles, concepts, and characteristics of the Kingdom. It also highlights the history and relationship between the Kingdom, Israel and the Church. Emphasis is placed upon Christian's opportunitiwes and responsibilities to help advance God's Kingdom.

Peter Tsukahira is a graduate of Christ for the Nations Institute and holds a Master of Divinity degree from American Christian Theological Seminary. He, a widely-sought after conference speaker, is one of the pastors of Kehilat HaCarmel, the Executive Director of Carmel Communications and Mt Carmel Ministry Center. He has authored 3 books, God's Tsunami, My Father's Business: Transforming Society, and Culture of the Kingdom: A Journey of Restoration.

BIBT325: Pneumatology (The Study of the Holy Spirit)

8-10 September

25-27 August

Professor: Dr Jerry Horner

This course examines the Biblical teaching on the Holy Spirit, the third person of the Trinity. Emphasis is placed on the personality and deity of the Holy Spirit, His work in regeneration, sanctification, Spirit baptism and Christian service.

Dr Jerry Horner received a Th. D degree from Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary, and has served as dean of the School of Theology at Oral Roberts University, and as founding dean of the School of Divinity at Regent University, USA. He is the author of many books and articles in theological and educational journals, commentaries, biblical encyclopedias and dictionaries.

BIPT502: The Biblical Basis & Strategy of Missions

Professor: Dr Khoo Hin Hiong

This course is designed to clarify what the Bible teaches on missionary objectives and explains the relationship of the Trinity to missionary endeavors. It aims to familiarize students with the missionary activities of a New Testament Church. Through the use of case studies, each student will be stimulated to engage themselves for more vigorous mission work. Dr Khoo, with his personal experiences in touching 45 countries, will expound and illustrate the Biblical way of reaching the world with the Gospel.

Dr Khoo Hin Hiong, founder of International Christian Mission and CFNI Missions Fellowship, has taught missions to about 800 students for four years at Christ for the Nations Institute, USA, and missions and leadership skills at Haggai Institute, USA. He received the Kingdom Statesman Award from International Third World Leaders Association founded by the late Dr Myles Munroe, and established the Institute of Missiology in Singapore in partnership with Regent University, USA. Through his legal and business consultancy practice, he established a wide network in Singapore, and in several countries.


BIPT235: Conflict Management & Resolution

17-19 November

Professor: Dr Joseph Umidi

Provides perspectives on the rudiment of leading people through understanding conflicts. This course also focuses on the principles and praxis of the management: relating theory to practice, identifying constructive strategies, developing framework of techniques and processes, formulation of resolution methods and managing communications.

Dr Joseph Umidi received a D Min. from Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, is the Executive Vice President for Student Life at Regent University. He has served as a professor of ministry at Regent University for more than 25 years. He is the founder and president of Lifeforming Leadership Coaching, Inc. He has authored numerous articles and books dealing with church and organizational and personal transformation, and currently works in community and international transformation strategies with several ministry organizations in the developing nations.

In spite of his weakness, he went on to become a doctor, took 6 months no pay leave to go on medical mission trips and now he speaks with eloquence and confidence, preaching the good news to all he meets. Dr Chow Minyang, who serves in the Mission Department and was recently elected as one of our church board members, shares with FamilyLife@Grace.

FLG: Please introduce yourself to our readers.

CMy: Hello Gracians! My name is Minyang and I am 27 years old this year. I just tied the knot with my beautiful wife, Grace Lum, on 14th May 2016. I am a member of the YAYP Congregation and I attend Kairos cell. It is also my privilege to humbly serve you in the Executive Church Board and in the Grace Missions Committee.

FLG: Your family...

CMy: I am thankful for two wonderful parents. Many of you would know my mum, Bee Lian as a long-serving member of Grace Assembly. She

brought me to Christ. My dad is a prebeliever and we pray that one day, he will come to the saving knowledge of Christ. I have a younger sister, Gaomin, who works full time in Cru Singapore and serves actively in the young adults ministry. Her passion for the lost is unparalleled and she is a role model to me. FLG: And home is...

CMy: My wife and I am currently waiting for our Built-To-Order flat. We are currently staying at a cozy rented place of our own at Jurong West.

FLG: Can we say that you grew up in Grace Assembly. From infancy to adulthood?


CMy: My mum brought me to Grace Assembly when I was very young and gave me many opportunities to hear the gospel. She demonstrated the gospel through her love for me and our family! I have been in Grace for over 20 years - since the time I was in diapers till now. Sis Poh Suan was one of the nursery teachers who took great care of me when I was still on all fours. Pastor Peck Yin, Bro Joshua Fong, Sis Kim Mui, Bro Lim Nan, Bro Daniel Lim, Bro Clement Yee and Sis Soanne were among my Sunday School Teachers whom I fondly remember.

FLG: Some of us have come to know you at the Watchnite Service where you shared about your mission trips. Could you tell more about this life of yours?

CMy: I took a 6 month no-pay leave to do missions and it was the best decision of my life. In these 6 months, I went to Cambodia, Philippines, Indonesia and headed to India twice. Through these trips, God stretched my faith, taught me tons of lessons, allowed me to meet with inspiring brothers and sisters who spurred me on in my walk with God. He placed in my heart the burden for the lost and gave me a glimpse of how His prophecy to me (received in my R-AGE days) was going to be fulfilled – that I would be His mouthpiece in preaching His Word. There was such indescribable joy doing God's work, knowing that He watches over my every step.

FLG: You mentioned you were recently married. Would you like to introduce your partner to us?

CMy: I have just got married to my beautiful girlfriend of 8 years. We grew up in Grace Assembly but we never really talked to each other until Grace Retreat of 2007. She actually thought that I was way older than her, and was surprised to find out that I was actually her age. I was serving in the Grace Retreat then and asked her if she was keen to be interviewed for the recap video for the retreat. We began talking and got to know each other more. We went through medical school together and graduated in 2013. She has been my constant pillar of support in the many ups and downs of life.

FLG: Was it like a long-distance relationship at that time when you went on those Mission trips?

CMy: Although most of my trips were one to two weeks in duration, I went for multiple trips and at certain times, it felt like a long-distance relationship. I remembered a trip where I went deep into rebel territory in the Philippines to do medical missions and share the gospel. Tensions between these armed rebels and government troops were at an all-time high. Before I entered the rebel controlled areas, I messaged Grace to ask her to keep me in prayer. Subsequently, I did not have mobile reception for the next 3 days to update her on how we were doing. She was worried sick! There were moments in my journey that I felt homesick, but knowing that there was full support and encouragement for me when I headed out to serve God was heartening and reassuring.

FLG: How did you cope being away from your love ones?

CMy: With modern technology, it is easier to cope being away. In some areas, Skype, FaceTime and social media allowed us to reconnect on a platform more than just a call or a text message. In areas where reception is poor, my family photos and videos on my mobile reminded me that I am loved. However, the sadness of not being with my loved ones was overshadowed with the abundant joy I got from journeying with God, my true Beloved.

FLG: We live in an affluent society. Most young people like yourself are at the prime time of their lives, where they work hard to earn more money, buy a luxurious house and drive a flashy car. Why do you choose to live a different life? What/Who impacted you to pursue a path less travelled?

CMy: I work as a doctor in Tan Tock Seng Hospital and I thoroughly enjoy my work. God blessed me with many awards during my medical school days and as a specialist trainee. My life was great. I had job satisfaction, recognition and abundant Do not waste your time on things that have no kingdom value because our lives are as short-lived as vapours

finances. My path for the next decade was set. However, since the start of 2015, there was a sense of discontentment which grew within me. There was something more God wanted me to do with my life. One day, through a book that Wallis Sultan blessed me with, I realized the brevity of my life on earth. We all have only a short moment to live on this earth, and what we do now is going to have an impact on where and how we spend eternity. Many of us work so hard, gain so much money and store up so much on earth, not realizing that we cannot bring what we have earned to heaven. We enjoy our lives on earth, forgetting that we have eternity

ahead of us. If I had died that day, I would have regretted how I lived my life. Spurred on by this realization, I decided to forsake myself and my earthly desires and live a life for Christ alone.

FLG: Share with us, what were some of your victories


CMy: I have learnt first-hand on what it meant for God's power to be made perfect in my weakness. Stuttering was a big problem for me in Secondary School. I had people ridiculed me and laughed at my speech. However, when I preached in the mission field, there was confidence, passion and a fire that I knew was not from me. As a stutterer, I was amazed at how God gave me the strength and ability to preach His word. A stuttering preacher gives God all the glory.

Since my primary school days, English language had not been my forte. My teacher had to call my parents up to discussed about my poor performance in the subject. When I graduated from Junior College, I scored full points for all my other subjects, but barely passed English. When a friend told me to pen a book detailing the lessons learnt from my experiences in the mission field, I felt incapable. It was only after three months that I finally decided to embark on the project. When I began writing, thoughts and ideas flowed seamlessly into words. I could not stop writing. If I wrote the book with my own strength, I would have never gotten past the first chapter. But with God, His strength is made perfect through my weakness.

FLG: Could you tell us more about this book of yours?

CMy: The book that I have written is entitled "Living for Eternity". It detailed the many lessons God has taught me through the heartwrenching, harrowing, and adrenaline filled experiences I have had in the mission field. Through my journey and study of God's word, I penned down what living for eternity meant. In 28 chapters, 30,000 words, I

recollected God's faithfulness, His protection, providence through the trials and challenges I faced in the mission field. I hope that this book will spur many to rethink how they are living their lives. I hope it



will also lead Christians to step out in faith to do extraordinary things for God and to live life with a sense of urgency because time is short. FLG: How has God played a part in this extra-ordinary journey of yours?

CMy: God has been the author of every experience that I have been through in this journey and in my life. He carefully orchestrated each lesson, timed each to perfection and protected me through every trial. He miraculously opened many doors for me to serve Him humbly. I am tremendously excited about where He will lead me and my wife in the future, for His glory.

FLG: What would you like to tell Grace members.....

CMy: My heart is bursting with so many lessons and stories that I would love to share with you all. Look at your life on earth with the perspective of eternity. Let us be good stewards of our time on earth. Do not build barns to store up earthly treasures, but give these earthly treasures away in exchange for heavenly ones. Do not waste your time on things that have no kingdom value because our lives are as short-lived as vapours. Be faithful in the small things and God will entrust you with even bigger things! Go out and make disciples in Singapore and in all nations and you will experience the reality of what Christ meant when He said, "And I will be with you always, till the very end of the age".

How To Get Real Face Time With Your Teen

Understanding the differences between our generation and theirs

Teenagers – don't we sometimes wish we understood them a little better, or knew what they were thinking? Why are they always staring at their screens? Why do they keep talking about finding meaning in life? Today's teenagers are growing up in a generation different from ours, facing more societal pressures and challenges than we ever did. We may not fully comprehend or agree with their thoughts or views, but knowing the differences between our generation's thinking and theirs might help us understand them a little better.

Communication Today

Do you find that our young ones have shorter attention spans? Technology likely has a part to play in this. Being digital natives, they are adept at quickly and easily sourcing for new information at any place and point in time. Indeed, a webpage that took two minutes to load in the past now can load in two seconds! However, though they may find difficulty in focusing on something for extended periods of time, they are often better at multitasking and managing several activities at the same time.

Also, gone are the days when face-to-face interaction was the only way to communicate with someone at length. Our teens have communication at their fingertips, keeping in touch with their friends through various forms of instant messaging and social media. Due to this, they may be more comfortable communicating virtually as opposed to meeting face-to-face or making phone calls.

It is still good to make—and guard—face-to-face interaction with them as a family. For example, you can agree as a family to ensure that there's no digital devices at the dinner table, so that everyone can focus on quality conversations. We should also model such behaviour for our teens by being intentional in not checking our phones or laptops constantly when spending time with them.

Engaging on Values

What was considered taboo in the past is now more widely accepted. Youth's attitudes toward things like media consumption, dressing, and sex, among many other areas, have become more liberal. One of the reasons for this is that our culture has changed. For instance, today's culture is markedly more accepting of sexually explicit content, where it can be found from product advertisements to music videos.

Someone once observed that the older generation seems to be the "What" generation: They know what is right and wrong, and they will do as they have been taught. But the younger generation seems to be the "Why" generation: They want to know why something is right or wrong, before they do it.

This mindset can be a productive one to engage with. The benefit is that youths want to know for themselves the compelling reasons behind something, rather than accept it blindly. And once they have thought or wrestled through it, they will likely have ownership over their own convictions.

Engaging with our youths in terms of values can also take the form of inviting them into a conversation about why they think the way they think. How did they come to such a view? Whom or what do they consider major influences in their lives? What do they cherish and what do they dislike? This also helps us to understand them as a person, and what their inner world is like.

The Bottom Line

Your teen may hold vastly different views from you – some may make you squirm or even recoil in horror. Before you start on a "You know in my time, this would never be allowed..." lecture, take some time to truly listen and evaluate your teen's views. Opening up safe spaces for dialogue lets them feel valued because they are being heard, which allows them to express their views more openly. This then creates opportunities for you to learn from them, and also to help them to clarify—and when the need arises, to gently correct—their beliefs and attitudes. Ultimately, our aim in parenting is to teach them how to think, not what to think, and empowering them to make healthy decisions themselves.

In all honesty, youths today share many similarities with you when you were teenagers – they are still finding their way around the confusing world they are in, still desire to be accepted, heard and loved. You may not completely understand (or appreciate) their psyche, but you can be the present and loving parent to them, guiding them as they grow into adulthood. Dads and Mums, may you be your teen's coach and cheerleader so that they can run the race of life well.



Community Befriending

Prov 17:17 A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for a time of adversity.

Need friends, be friends

Most of us are willing to open up to friends, and we are less uncomfortable asking for, or receiving help from friends. Not so with strangers. And so it is with the Community. It is hard to trust people, or be too transparent to those we do not know, or just know as passing acquaintances.

The crucial "door-opening" step for our Church to be successful in Community Engagement is to be successful in Community Befriending.

Community Befriending involves Church members going into the Community intentionally to get to know people, and to build friendships with them, and finding ways to share Christian love and genuine care with the people living near to where our Church is located. It is all about being present.

Geographical Focus

Technically we can befriend anyone and anywhere. However to be effective as a group, we would rather not spread ourselves out too thinly, but instead just focus persistently on the same Communities. Overtime, stronger and more lasting relationships can be built. Hong Kah North where GII is, and Tanglin, Lengkok Bahru, Henderson and Tiong Bahru close to where GI is would be our natural focus areas.



The Least, the Lost and the Lonely

The needs in the Community are many. In the past, we have focussed primarily on the economically needy. That is still correct today, but progressively, our need to also open the envelope to include other needs. For instance, as our population ages, loneliness, particularly for Seniors who are living alone and without the the socio-emotional support of their families, are being identified as high risk groups susceptible to depression. People can be lonely regardless of their economic situation. Similarly at-risk youths from dysfunctional or non-intact families need the love, encouragement and support from friends for strength to backtrack from the fringe.

Grace Communities in Synergy with RCSS

RCSS is a very good platform to enable Grace AG Members to meaningful engage the Community. RCSS works with the needy in the Community, know them and have access

to them, and can act as the bridge to bring the Community and the Church together. The best delivery mechanism the Church can use for this effort is the Grace Communities (Cell Groups).

The synergy comes in that while social work can only go some distance, the human resource in RCSS is limited to spending any appreciable amount of time with each client. On the other hand, the Church with the missional goal to engage the Community can provide ample volunteer resource via the cell groups to carry this hope and warmth in Christ into the needy households, extending the impact of the social work from the outside with the transformational work of the Spirt from the inside. Befriending by a Grace Group is liken to bringing a lighted candle into a dark room, and liken to adding salt that restores the flavour in a life that has lost its hope and purpose.

Community Befriending and Project Neigbour

Community Befriending dovetails perfectly into Grace Assembly's Project Neighbour. In the past, Project Neighbour is a one-day in a year food-ration project. Members come together a day in the year to deliver food rations to the needy. Both givers and receivers are blessed. However, due to the limited contact time and the lack of opportunity to revisit the recipient households, apart from a positive impression, there is little leeway for further development.

Community Befriending cum Project Neighbour in synergy will be different. Lesser households will be selected, but a better match can be achieved and with each household tagged to a Grace Group, will follow the same on a routine basis for a period of time.

A "small gift", (largely rations, but can be customized to the needs of the specific family) will be brought along on each visit. Since customised, the gift will always be a welcome relief for the family. The focus however is not on the gift, but on building a genuinely caring relationship. Eventually, on the strength of a strong and trusting friendship, evangelistic opportunities may be possible

We can do it

COMMUNI SERVICES SOCIETY Befriending is not difficult, and it can be learned and polished, just as in our own social circles or in our work, we all make friends and develop friendships.

For reaching the Community, we need however to be intentional, and approach it with a missional goal to stretch out hands ready to help, hearts with compassion, ears ready to listen, and mouths ready to speak kind words. I am sure as needed, the Holy Spirit can give us utterance.

THE LION KING COMES TO TOWN


An Evangelistic Meeting with Disney Animator, Davy Liu

He was like them in his youth, and struggled with poor self-image and disappointments when compared to his higher achieving siblings. That was before he chanced upon a teacher-mentor who believed in him, and encouraged and

empowered him to pursue his God given gift and passion – drawing. Through winning a series of art competitions, he soon caught the attention of the Disney Studio. He became their first Asian in the feature animation team. He was then 19 years old. There his skills were honed, and soon he was a master in creative animation and scriptwriting. Davy also worked a while with George Lucas at Industrial Light and Magic and Warner Bros. Feature Animation, and his illustrations have graced the pages of prominent publications such as Business Week, Time Magazine and Wall Street Journal, of which he was nominated as the most distinctive illustrator in 2000.

Apart from hosting regular animation workshops and motivational speaking, Davy has also been actively sharing how his Christian faith has inspired him to realise his story at churches and Christian events across Northern America and different parts of Asia.

Davy often recalls his father's words encouraging him to embrace and utilise his gifted talents, and his art teacher would also spur him on with the words of 'You can do it'. These empowerments instilled in him the confidence and passion in continuing to pursue his dreams of combining illustrations and words, and led Davy to setup Kendu Films in 2004, in hopes of bringing a positive message and mindset to inspire his audience, great content to enlighten children with a 'Can Do' spirit and compelling positive parenting through great story telling. Currently, he is working on a series of animation and picture books call the "Invisible Tails" series (www.kendufilms. com), retelling historical stories in a brand new perspective

We thank you so much for being prayerful and financially supportive of Grace Missions. As of now, August 2016, Grace Missions has raised \$1,451,192. We would like to thank you for your partnership, and we urge you to continue to actively participate in the great work that God is doing in the nations!

Last year, we had 95 missions trips participated by 362 missions trippers. In this half year mark, we have had 48 missions trips with 141 missions trippers! TO THE ENDS OF WEST KALIMANTAN BY FELICIA TAN, YAYP

11 people. 7 days. One unforgettable journey.





With a total of four days on the road, and only three days' worth of ministry work, the trip was to us — going into the ends of the Earth.

As we set off for our journey into the village, the further we went, the more rural the experience. On our road journeys, the roads were unstable but we soon got used to the common occurrence of pothole incidents. It was also in these moments that we witnessed the power of prayer! Twice we were told that our plans would be delayed because the car was stuck, but immediately after praying, we would receive news that all was well again! Praise God!

Village life required the men to bathe in the river, and the ladies to shower in the dark with a torchlight. Blackouts was a norm. For some of us, we had to overcome our fear of insects and bugs.

In our three days of ministry work, we travelled to three villages and we were often greeted with a "Thank you so much for coming all the way in to visit us." To be on the receiving end of such hospitality and immense gratitude was humbling.

As we minister to them in the different areas — Community Time, Children's Service, Revival Service, and Home Visitations. We saw God's hands in our plans. With every service and home visitation, we saw God's perfect timing as He gave us promptings through affirmations of the Word and through one another.

The time taken to travel into this rural village, from the nearest city was at least 5 – 6 hours long, and so the team wondered, "How did these villagers come to know God?" The local pastor then shared with us that back in the 1970s, there was an American missionary who came to their village and shared Christ with them. So amazing! If our experience was "to the ends of the Earth" for us then what more for this missionary back then? Truly, God always works in amazing ways we could not foresee.

After hearing their stories and praying for them, we went back home blessed and humbled. We were encouraged by their hunger and desire for more of God and His Word. It made us want to have such a desire for God too. We have been tremendously blessed, and so we pray that our sharing would encourage you and go forth to reach the world for God!

Going for this trip was a step out of my comfort zone. Before the trip, I felt that I was physically and mentally unprepared. So I asked God to provide me with a training ground prior to the trip. Then God granted me this opportunity. I was asked to help out for a youth camp, which was two days before the trip itself. God's presence was so strong in even the inner reaches of Borneo! To me, it really did feel like the 'ends of the Earth,' as we had to spend over half the trip travelling, often through muddy and unstable terrains.

The hospitality of the villagers was amazing. Each day, we were provided with abundance – from hearty meals to being driven around by volunteers from the church's congregation. They gave



their all, even when they had little. Their love for God prevailed even though they did not have much worldly possessions and to me. The villagers' hunger for God made me reflect on my personal walk.

I realised how complacent I had been in being 'contented' in my relationship with God. It is all too easy to worship Him when things are going smoothly, but will we do the same if troubles occur? For me, it was a reminder to humble myself and rediscover my first love for God.

Even though what we did might not seem a lot, if no one reaches out to these remote areas, then who will? There are so many other villages and cities that need encouragement and evangelism, so I urge you to step out of your comfort zone and impact the world for Jesus!

R-AGE IN WEST KALIMANTAN

Let God. That was something we were constantly reminded of as our team made up of Pastor Joey Asher and 7 R-AGE Youth leaders concluded our week long missions trip to West Kalimantan. From last minute message changes as prompted by the Holy Spirit, to times of ministry where tears flowed freely, we realised there is little we can actually do, but when we let God and His will prevail, that's when when hearts are moved, eyes are opened and lives are transformed.

In the weeks leading up to our departure, we were starting to have a better idea of what we were going to be doing in terms of ministry - church visits on the first few days, run a Youth camp for the middle part of the trip and end off with a few children programmes towards the end of our time there. Did it happen that way? I guess you would say yes it did. But boy, oh boy, did God work in a way that none of us could have ever imagined!

Here's a quick run down of the different kinds of ministries that we were involved in:

Church Visits: We visited a few small village churches and had the honour of preaching the Word and sharing our personal testimonies. We were consistently blown away by the kindness and hospitality of our hosts. The passion of the church members was also such a beautiful sight to witness. I remember one night, we were at a village which was a 45 minute car ride from where we were staying and the power cut out before the service started. Where that would have made quite an issue elsewhere, the local congregation took out a small light, plugged it in and turned it towards the pulpit and the service went on as per normal.

"Walking with God" Youth Camp: For many of us, this was the highlight of the trip. Much of our planning time was invested in preparing for this 220 - strong Youth Camp that we would be running for 3 days. It was anchored on the theme of Walking with God. At first glance, we were in for a rough time. Getting to our location on the first day and realising a couple of things, the local committee planned for accommodation for the Youth had fallen through, the hall was too small and poorly lit and there were two other church camps happening in the same beach vicinity! Despite all the initial challenges though, as a team, we pressed forward in a trust that God's plan was far greater than ours. It was. God used us as his vessels and moved in that place through such a powerful way. On the second night, 30 - 40 youth were slain in the Spirit as we prayed for the baptism of the Holy Spirt, people began manifesting as God moved in their hearts, setting them free from bondage and healing deep wounds and hurts buried deep in the depths of their souls. It was an amazing time! Much of the rest of the camp was similar. We spent time running workshops teaching that God can be found in every moment of everyday! In nature, during our personal quiet time and even in encouraging moments between friends. We also ran games that explained spiritual warfare and the importance of unity in the body of Christ. The final morning before we left, we organised a prayer tunnel, and all I can say is that God wasn't done in that place yet. He moved mightily again, transforming lives and changing perspectives, flooding us with His grace and love. Leaving the camp was bittersweet. It had been such a physically and emotionally training time, but at the same time it was such a joy to be part of God moving in these young peoples' lives. As they say in Bahasa Indonesia, Satu Lagi (one more).

Children Programmes: The final few days of the trip were devoted to the running of children programmes. It was such a joy to be involved in these kids lives, some of them, never having ever seen Singaporeans in their village before! We brought sweets and games and distributed water bottles for them to keep. We taught them "Father Abraham" And "Deep Down in My Heart". We acted out the story of Peter walking on water and got all the children to fold their own boats. Praying over the boats together we brought them down to a nearby stream and set them down. Making a declaration that we are going to trust God with our lives, the same way Peter did as he stepped out of the boat. Standing in the stream with the kids, seeing the colourful paper boats flowing down the stream made my heart sing. It was such a beautiful sight. What an honour for us as a team to be part of this moment in these kids' lives.

Much more happened, and honestly, I could go on for ages. There was the rocky truck ride where we had a mango-sized wedged into tire, the time where we forded a river at night, that time when the women of our team began casting out demons praying to the point of tears, when the men of our team began understanding that us moving those slain in the Spirit is as much ministry as praying for the binner of tears.

每个年轻的男女都曾憧憬会遇上自己的梦中情人。我也不 例外。有一天,我终于遇到了他。可能我的思想比较早 熟,数年后我跟他的思想逐渐有了差距,最终和他分手 了。过后,我为生活拼搏,工作忙碌,虽有结交异性, 但无奈只是开了花却没有结果!二十多年后,我和他再次 重逢。当时我仍然是单身,但他已经是一个妇人的丈夫和 三个孩子的父亲了。由于分手后我们彼此仍旧有想念着对 方,加上因他工作的关系,我们有了接触的机会,就这样 我们又重新开始了。我们也从此铸成大错!

在我们重新开始不久,其实他的妻子便已察觉到了。只是 她为了保护家庭和孩子,便默默的承受痛苦,并且超忍耐 的容忍我们的过错,甚至连她的儿女也不知情。就因为我 们的自私,她受了将近十年的折磨。这些年来,在这段纠 缠不清的三角关系中,我们都活得不快乐,不同的是她是 无辜的,而我们却是活该的。

在写这见证的过程中,我不只一次的流泪痛哭。我为曾经 造成他妻子的伤害而哭,也为神如何用他的慈绳爱索牵引 我回转而哭。你若爱神爱人,就不会使神伤心,也不会使 人痛苦。圣灵还提醒我,主耶稣已经将苦杯换了蜜糖!亲 爱的弟兄姐妹,如果今天你也在苦杯的当中,我想对你 说,唯有主耶稣能将你的苦杯变成蜜糖!
