I am Nell from the Young Adults Young Professionals (YAYP) congregation in Grace Assembly of God. Towards the second half of 2018, I sensed the Lord's prompting to "serve and build the local church" in 2019. In obedience to that, I applied for the Grace Apprenticeship Program (GAP). I started the internship programme in January this year and have not looked back since!

To give you a clearer picture of my internship experience, I thought it would be useful to first list out some of my responsibilities in the two main ministries that I am involved in – NEXUS and Creative Arts Ministry (CAM), and then share some of my reflections and takeaways. (NEXUS is the next-generational ministry that comprises Grace Kids, R-AGE Youth and YAYP.)

Some of my responsibilities in NEXUS include: mentoring a worship leader at Sparkle/Shine (children service), overseeing the worship ministry at Emerge (preteens service), preaching at Elevate (youth service), leading transition cell (youths transiting from Elevate to YAYP), and serving in the worship teams at YAYP service. Some of my responsibilities in CAM include: spearheading the creative aspects of our Good Friday and Easter production services, CAM audition-interview-training process, as well as serving at J333s. I am also involved in Gracesongs (writing, studio recording, song release) and Grace Retreat YAYP committee.

Prior to this internship, I had little idea on what it is like to be part of the preteens ministry. Thus, my sudden leadership involvement in Emerge has been a queer learning curve. Whilst discovering more about the ministry culture and needs, I was simultaneously trying to train and raise worship leaders and musicians. This experience has given me a taste of the leadership and strategy-making roles of a minister, and I have much to learn indeed.

Next, preaching at Elevate was an extremely refreshing and thrilling experience for me. Although it was demanding and stressful to prepare speaking to a congregation that I have not been a part of in a long while, I was very grateful for the privilege to share with the youths. I preached on worship and warfare, which is a topic close to my heart that I have wrestled with the Lord over the years through challenging life experiences. Knowing that the congregation was edified and convicted by the message greatly encouraged and humbled me. Praise God!


Of course, leading transition cell has not been easy (just looking at the sheer huge number of 50 members in the cell!), but I am grateful to be serving alongside committed and reliable lay co-leaders in the ministry. As someone who has been through many different transitions (especially during my time of overseas university studies), I have a soft spot for the youths in this season of life and I greatly treasure this privilege of investing in them. Be it those who are waiting for university, waiting to enter National Service, or even choosing to take a gap year, I believe each season is a precious gift from God, even that of waiting. It is my prayer that these youths will seize this transition period and use it to magnify God's name.

Not to forget, the major project that I worked on was the Good Friday and Easter production services in April. Handling eight services over that weekend was a hefty and challenging task, needless to say! It was tough

managing expectations on how things should look like, and settling the manpower (finding the right people for the right roles) was also not easy. But if you were to ask me if I would choose to do it again, I would say yes in a heartbeat. From start to finish, planning to execution, I enjoyed every part of it. I loved being able to push creative borders and explore bringing something refreshing yet relevant to the services. Moreover, serving alongside dedicated and excellent groups of inter-generational teams (including worship, dance, drama, service) was such a blessing. I thank the leaders for trusting me to share the love of God through creative expressions on those platforms. Jesus is truly spectacular and I hope we revealed a little more of His glory that weekend!

THE PRAYER OF A DESPERATE PARENT SERIES

THE RIGHT TO BE KIND

My son Daniel, has a friend named Sing. He lives downstairs in our condo with his older brother who is perpetually drunk. They're not Christians. They're raised by a maid whom their parents hired as a legal guardian. The parents live separate lives in different countries. Sing has no one to put him to bed or comfort him when he's hurt. His parents throw money at the kids and give them anything they want except their attention and presence.

Sing can sometimes say mean, stupid things to hurt and annoy Daniel. But I've told Daniel he needs to continue to be Sing's friend. Sing is welcome to my home anytime, where he has to watch his language and my husband and I offer advice and listen to his problems. Many nights, when I pray for my kids, I pray for Sing too.

Most Christian parents would ask their kids not to mix with someone like Sing. But I've told my kids, "You may not need Sing. But Sing needs you. You are the only Jesus in Sing's life."

In our Christian walk, Christ doesn't command us to be right but to be loving – to love our neighbour as ourselves. How do we help our kids honour this commandment where their friends – both Christians and non Christians – are concerned?

1. Kindness outweighs self-righteousness

Eph 3:43 says "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." While the gospel of Christ is the power of God to salvation, our display of the fruits of the Spirit is the most effective way to turn a person's heart around. Rom 2:4 says *It's God's kindness that leads us to repentance.* Jesus never played the 'holier than thou' card when dealing with sinners. He paid attention to tax collectors. He acknowledged prostitutes. He hung out with sinners. And they changed. They got saved. They fell in love with Him. We need to teach our children to display the attributes of Christ - compassion, love and kindness. These will attract those in darkness and turn their hearts to Christ.

2. Compassion outweighs judgement

A couple of months back, when my kids came home from French class, Daniel took me aside and said, "Mom, there's a really mean kid in class whom everyone hates – Sarah is the only one who is nice to him. He keeps using her iPhone. I think he's bullying her and she's scared to say no." I've repeatedly talked to my kids about not bullying others as well as how to stand up to bullies and ask for help when they need to. So imagine my concern and annoyance at the thought of my 8-year old daughter being bullied?!

I broached the subject carefully with Sarah and asked her for her side of the story. Boy, was I in for a surprise. "I'm not being bullied, Mom. Yes, he's a mean boy but that's because everyone says nasty things to him. You told me to show kindness. So I did. I asked him if he wanted to borrow my iPhone and now he's my friend. I think he's funny and nice."

I looked her in the eye and said, "You're sure you're not lending it to him because you're afraid of him?" She said, "No, I feel good about myself, Mom, because everyone else is scared of him and I am not. He's really my friend."

My daughter in the midst of the adversity, extended her iPhone as an olive branch to a boy who was desperate for attention and acceptance. I was glad she did that.

It reminded me of how Jesus dealt with Peter. Here was a guy who had been hanging out with the Messiah every day for 3 years. You'd think his faith would be strong and he wouldn't deny his Master. But no! Peter blew it big time. He denied Christ not once but thrice. The disciples would have been judging him secretly. I bet they gossiped about how disappointed Jesus would be with Peter. But Jesus didn't shame him. He acknowledged him and restored him to his calling. His compassion outweighed the judgement of others. We must teach our children to view their friends through the compassionate eyes of God, and not through the judgemental eyes of men.

3. Action outweighs words

St Francis of Assisi said, "Preach Christ. If you must, use words." I don't deny the power of words. But these words must be supported by actions. In James 2:14-26, James talks about the power of putting action to our faith. Without it, our faith is as good as dead. Before we had kids, my husband and I used to dog-sit for a neighbour. He was a bachelor living on his own with a golden retriever, in our condo. We became fast friends, and when I cooked and had extra food, I gave him some. This happened at least twice a week – and he was so grateful. Sometimes we'd have meals together and chat, and we'd tell him about our weekend in church serving God. After a year of feeding of friendship, he told us he was so touched by our kindness to him and love for God, he wants to follow us to church. He gave his life to Jesus and has been a very dedicated Christian since. To be really honest, we weren't showing him kindness as a way in to preach the gospel. We did it because we just wanted to bless him. But that friendship bore fruits in ways we never expected.

Every small opportunity to help, make a difference, feed someone, could change and touch lives in ways you never imagined possible. And our kids have the power to do these small acts in a sincere and genuine way if we raise them right to be Christlike in their daily lives. So, let's make a commitment as parents to teach our kids that they don't always have to be right and win every argument. But the right thing to do in any situation is to be kind, because this will touch and change lives for the better.

With each progressive game of passing the marbles, passing the ping pongs and passing the nuts, the noise level at the centre hit higher decibels as the teams which finished their tasks had to shout to catch the game masters' attention. Things quickly escalated into a frenzy when the teams pitted their bible knowledge against one another in bible trivia quizzes. These were done in between games where they had the chance to gain extra points. The excitement reached a climax during the final game named Eiffel Tower, where teams had to engineer the tallest standing structure using materials such as straws, chopsticks, wooden blocks and tape. The "ingenious" ways in which each team tried to win were amazing, as the game master had to cheekily remind everyone to keep to the rules by quoting Proverbs 5:21, "For your ways are in full view of the LORD, and he examines all your paths."

Dedication of Two New Community Touchpoints by RCSS

2019 is indeed an exciting year for REACH Community Services Society (RCSS) with the launch of two new community touchpoints, Family Service and Senior Service, which took place after rounds of delays.

After many months of planning and dialogue with the Ministry of Social and Family Development (MSF) and various government agencies, the new service centre branch at Sin Ming began operations on 1 February 2019, enabling us to bring our range of social services closer to the residents of Bishan North and Sin Ming.

Developing almost in tandem, the REACH Senior Centre @ Bukit Gombak Vista had its first event in mid-December last year. Senior work was also carried out in the shared premises of REACH Youth Powerhouse at Block 417 Bukit Batok West Avenue 4.

The commissioning of the new REACH Senior Centre @ Bukit Gombak Vista provides yet another strategic engagement platform to better reach and engage the communities in Hong Kah North, Bukit Batok, Bukit Gombak and Choa Chu Kang.

The dedication ceremonies for the two new community touchpoints were held on 23 Feb 2019 and 26 April 2019 for REACH Senior Centre @ Bukit Gombak Vista and Family Service Centre at Sin Ming, respectively. Senior Pastor Calvin Lee, who is also Advisor to the Management Committee of RCSS blessed the staff and facilities, encouraging them to serve the community diligently and effectively, doing good work in the context of doing God's work.

With the dedication of the premises unto God's hands, we pray that these two additional touchpoints will not be merely physical centres but lighthouses of hope to the least, the lost and the lonely; that more lives will be touched and ministered to with the compassionate love of Christ through the services offered regardless of language, race, religion or sexual orientation.

As always, social work and counselling are all that we can do from the outside. However, true and lasting changes for the better can only happen when the Holy Spirit does His transformation work from the inside. For unless the Lord builds the house, we as labourers will labour in vain.

Geri Ngo (not real name) has been a Christian for 9 years. She joined Grace Assembly of God 5 years ago and has since settled down with the YAYP ministry. She has a heart for the nations and joined the Discipleship Training School by Youth with a Mission, doing her outreach in East Asia as well as in North Korea. This is her story.

Last year, I celebrated Christmas in North Korea. We played games, sang carols, and exchanged gifts. Having read so much about the nation before the trip, I never would have thought it possible to attend a Christmas party there with families from different nations. That evening, we gave thanks for the gift of laughter. God was there with us.

What was most encouraging for me was the time spent with the brothers and sisters living and working there long-term. Would you raise your children in North Korea? Or live in a country where communication with other nations is limited? Well, they would, and currently are doing so because God called and they simply obeyed. In this place portrayed as having so much darkness and negativity, I got a little glimpse of how God sees the nation through their sharing and perspectives. While others may see gloom and doom, they see purity and opportunity. They genuinely love the nation and its people. It blew my mind to hear their stories of how God

opened doors and made ways for them to serve the locals through various means. God was teaching me that He is truly Lord over all circumstances and political situations. He is sovereign!

Our brothers and sisters in North Korea do not share the good news like we do here at home. They can only reflect Christ through their lives. In those few days I was there, I experienced the infectious joy, kindness and love they exuded in relating to others. I saw their creativity in solving problems and humility before God and others. Paul says that we are living letters from Christ to the world (2 Corinthians 3:2-3). When we do not speak of Him, can our co-workers, classmates, and family members see Christ in us? Are we living each day as His love letter to those around us?

God is working among the nations and only He has the master plan. We can trust that God knows best and that there is truly no place too dark or closed off for Him. Let's partner with Him by praying for our brothers and sisters there, that they would continually draw strength from the Lord and that His peace will guard their hearts. We must keep praying for reunification between the North and South, and, most importantly, for souls to be restored.

WE DID NOT KNOW WHAT THEY WOULD DO TO US...

Fear. The scent of fear and the dread of utter helplessness. To be at the mercy of human traffickers you do not know, yet having no choice but to trust them. That's a very scary thing.

These words were uttered by an Afghan refugee teenager, Sarah*, residing in Indonesia. Last year, I led a team of people to visit several refugee schools within a two-hour flight radius from us. It was during one of the home visits when we had more time that the Sarah opened up and shared with us her family's harrowing escape and journey from Afghanistan to Indonesia.

Coming from 'safe' and 'predictable' Singapore, where most of the time we are generally in full control of our lives, I am not sure if any of us can even come close to understanding a situation like that, except in the movies!

She paused and said, "It was so dark. They could have killed us and no one would know about it."

different they looked. But how do you hide your distinct facial features and skin colour? Think about the stares that some of them would receive if they stepped outside their villages and towns. It is not a perceived threat. It is real. Death threats and actual killings have already taken place.

The journey from Afghanistan to Indonesia was long and Sarah particularly remembered the time when she was ferried across the Straits of Malacca

By the way, for those who are not very savvy in geography, feel free to either pull out a world map at this point or use Google Maps to see what route is recommended from Afghanistan to Indonesia. (Spoiler: You might see an error message).

Sarah's family belonged to an ethnic minority, the Hazaras, who were persecuted and judged for being religiously unorthodox and how

to Sumatra. She said, "It was so dark. They could have killed us and no one would know about it."

Perhaps you have been on-board a cruise ship sailing in these waters. I myself recall seeing numerous small boats on these same waters – perhaps some were ferrying refugees. The next time you are on a cruise and see these boats from your sea-view balcony rooms, pray for them.

Today, Sarah helps out as a teacher at her previous refugee school. While she is happy that she is able to give back to her community, she still waits for the opportunity to one day live and work in Australia.

Every journey is unique and worthy to be captured in a book or be made into a movie. In fact, she said that she was in the process of writing about her journey. Perhaps it would help to heal some of her trauma, as well as give strength to others while helping them develop more empathy. When was the last time you were acquainted with such a person? Perhaps now our complaints will all but fade away...May more come to a 'Thomas moment' and confess, "My Lord and my God!" (John 20:28)

But have we quoted Genesis 12:1-3?

Will you live it out?
Will you step up?
Will you act on it?

The world needs to know our God.
The nations need to hear of this God.
The people groups need to experience a God.

Our God, this God, a God so LOVING.
So, so loving, that He chose to die for us.

When will you go?
When will you start?
When will you obey?

Before it is too late?

I'm no stranger to fear of death, to fear of inconvenience, to fear of the unhygienic, to fear of language barriers. But what God has placed in me, I cannot resist. Once I obey, I am a joyful soul. God has called us to be missional, but do I know what it means to be missional?

It isn't simply about sharing the gospel, packing my bags, and going home after that. It is about living out the truth; relating with others, empathising with them when I hear their stories, and eventually leading them to know who God is.

I've always heard stories of Singkawang. Yet I had not experienced it. Not until I went to see the place for myself, that my heart became full – full from the love the local workers have for the villagers. They were living out missional values in their everyday lives!

A pastor whom I met there starts his day at 6am. He eats his breakfast at 7am, drives and visits his church members door-to-door at 8am, eats his lunch at 12pm, rests at 1pm, sets off to ferry his church members at 2pm, completing multiple trips by 6pm and sometimes up to 7pm.

Just so that they can all go to church.

Once service is over, he would do the same, all the way till 9pm, sometimes 10, and finally hits the sack at midnight. He has done this for over a year now, and the villagers are warming up to him. They bring their neighbours to church, and their neighbours slowly tell others about this church and that's how the gospel is shared.

But, my friends, this is not enough. A man with a vision needs a team to live it out and more work can be done not just in Singkawang, but everywhere too!

We cannot be missional, unless we are really acting out on our mission that God has called us to.

Will you come, and see the nations too?
