EMBRACING THE SUCCESSION

*An Interview with
Pastor Calvin Lee*

For any establishment, a planned leadership transition is very important. It serves to prevent any disruption to the smooth running of the organisation and ensures its continued success as well. From the time Pastor Calvin Lee took over as Senior Pastor of Grace Assembly of God, succession was already on his mind as he knew the importance of always being prepared for the future.

"Not only is leadership transition important, it must also be intentional and Spirit-inspired," he said.

For those reasons, Pastor Calvin is thankful that the Lord has directed this whole succession-planning process that will culminate in an official installation ceremony on 31 December.

"God's hand was clearly involved in this whole process, including His prompting of Pastor Wilson Teo and preparing of Pastor Wilson's heart towards this matter."

For Pastor Wilson, moving to Grace Assembly would represent a major shift in his life and ministry, and he must be convinced that this was God's leading as well.

"The way both of us ended up meeting was evidence of the strong divine hand of God and for this reason, I feel a sense of restedness," said Pastor Calvin.

The date for the actual transition was announced at the end of June earlier this year and Gracians, including the church leadership and staff, have by and large come to accept and wholeheartedly embrace this succession. "We are all believing God for a fresh new season ahead," he said.

Pastor Calvin said that both he and Pastor Wilson have been working

closely in this transition period to ensure a smooth and seamless handover so that Grace Assembly will move forward with continued strength and vigour.

"Since July, I have been slowly coming down from the mountain, so to speak, while Pastor Wilson has been slowly making the ascent," he added.

No Definite Plans After Stepping Down

Pastor Calvin confirmed that he has made no plans for the near

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future after stepping down as Senior Pastor. "My leaving the post is not because I have a plan or an offer from elsewhere," he said. "It is only to allow for the leadership succession which has always been important to me. The well-being of the church is like that of our own physical well-being; we don't wait for a need to arise before we take care of it."

Pastor Calvin revealed that he and Sister Charis have had no extended break in over 40 years of ministry. Come January, they will be able to enjoy up to six months of just taking a breather to rejuvenate as they prepare for whatever God may lead them to thereafter.

"No doubt, this was a huge decision, and we are thankful that the decision has been made. God has been very good to me as well as to our church, and I just want to do what is best for Grace Assembly which I have served for 30 years.

"We are more than grateful for everything. Now, it is time to step down amid wonderful and enriching memories. Meanwhile, we are entering into an exciting season as our journey of faith continues," he said, adding that Grace Assembly will remain their home church.

"Looking ahead, Grace Assembly of God will continue to move strongly as a missional family church under the capable leadership of Pastor Wilson, who will lead under the anointing of the Holy Spirit with all his heart.

"Next year, Grace Assembly will celebrate our 70th anniversary and Pastor Wilson is who God has ordained to lead this new season. Our destiny is to be missional with a strong outward focus on touching lives, winning souls and expanding God's kingdom at home and beyond."

On 31 December, Grace Assembly will hold a Thanksgiving-cum-Installation Service at 7.30pm at Grace@Tanglin (GI).

OCTOBER *Prayer Pointers*

2. Pray for wisdom, humility and courage for the people of Hong Kong, the government and the Church to handle the situation in a right and effective manner. Pray that healthy ways will be sought to navigate the divisions and bring about agreement. Pray that the people of Hong Kong will love one another in the midst of their differences in opinions and positions.
3. Pray that the Hong Kong government has discernment and wisdom to handle the demands of the protest movement. Pray that the Hong Kong government will be able to find ways to address the discontent in society and to look for good and right solutions to help the people of Hong Kong. Pray that trust and cooperation will return to the hearts of the Hong Kong people for their government.
4. Pray that the Church in Hong Kong will not join in the protest movement but will unite in prayer. In upholding justice, she will not resort to human wisdom but will rely on the wisdom of the Holy Spirit and the sovereignty of the Lord.
5. Pray for peace to return to the land of Hong Kong soon.



The Prayer Of A Desperate Parent Series

HELPING OUR KIDS DEAL WITH THEIR EVER-CHANGING EMOTIONS

At different stages of our kids' lives, they learn to deal with diverse and overwhelming emotions. As parents, we try to protect our kids from what the world deems as "negative" emotions. But as I raise my children, I've come to realise that the emotions the world deems as "negative", such as sadness, guilt and concern, become intensified when we have Jesus as our Lord and Saviour.

That's because our conscience comes alive. We become sensitive to the things that dishonour God, and there's a constant need to humble ourselves before God, and ask Him for forgiveness and grace to live righteous lives.

We need to teach our kids how not to look at these emotions as positive or negative, but to embrace and manage them as God-given, and with God's help, to channel them towards pleasing God. When they respond to the voice of their conscience, it guides them to walk before God with a pure heart.

Matthew 5:8 (NIV) says, 'Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.' We want to raise kids who can see God in every situation—good and bad. But these emotions can be overwhelming and they create tension within the kids. Our kids need to know how to respond and channel these emotions towards becoming better people for God.

Here are three typical emotional tension points and some principles to help your kids handle them right.

1. GUILT VS CONDEMNATION

Romans 8:1 (NIV) says, 'There is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus.' But condemnation and guilt are not the same. It's good to feel bad when you've done something wrong. It means your conscience hasn't been seared—it is alive and kicking.

When Sarah told me she had done something wrong and asked how to get rid of her guilt, I recited 1 John 1:9 (NIV), 'If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins.' We talked through what she had done wrong—she had hurt her friend and felt bad about it. I asked her if she had apologised and tried to make it right. She said yes, repeatedly.

Then we bowed our heads and prayed. Sarah told God she was sorry and asked Him to help her be a better person and prayed for her friend to feel better about the whole thing. Then she opened her eyes full of tears, smiled and said, "I feel much better, Mum." We then agreed to put it aside and move on. I was glad that she was conscious of her wrongdoing. It means she will think before hurting someone next time.

Children are not too young to make their wrong right with the person they've hurt and ask God for forgiveness when they do something wrong. As parents, we need to inculcate this as a good, Godly habit in them.

2. DIVINE DISCONTENT VS DISSATISFACTION

Our kids need a holy discontent—a need to better themselves to become who God wants them to be. In a previous issue, I wrote about a conversation with my son feeling stressed because he wants to do well in life. He has a constant desire to make himself better. That's because within each one of us is a raging battle between our need for convenience and God's seed of destiny in our heart. Within our children, their spirit man is pushing them towards excellence. Their spirit man knows what God has called them to do. God has put destiny in their hearts. But it's not easy when their human nature is pushing for convenience, urging them to take the easy way out.

Even in our Christian walk, Paul says in Philippians 2:12-13 (NIV) to 'work out your salvation with fear and trembling'. Here Paul is not talking about working for our salvation—Jesus has paid the price on the cross for that. He's talking about working out our salvation—in obedience to God.

John Piper, the renowned theologian, reminds us that obedience for Christians is neither the rock upon which our salvation rests nor the optional ribbon placed upon eternal life. It is essential. It is arduous. And it is empowered by God. The desire and need to obey God isn't just about observing a set of God-made rules; it's about finding our God-destined purpose and living it out to the fullest. And in that process, there will be a constant divine discontent pushing us to this purpose. We need to help our children see this.

The sad truth is, our kids can sometimes mistake dissatisfaction for discontent. Proverbs 19:23 says God satisfies us. He satisfies our soul with every good thing. Dissatisfaction comes from a lack of gratitude and is not the same as divine discontent. Where discontent pushes you from your slumber, dissatisfaction puts you in the seat of stagnation where you are so busy complaining about your situation that you refuse to look for the door out.

When your kids murmur about things, push them to seek God and find a way out. Help them with God's grace and turn their dissatisfaction into divine discontent.

3. FEAR OF GOD VS FEAR OF MAN

We teach our children that fear is bad. But not all fear is bad. 'The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom.' (Proverbs 9:10; NIV). Fearing the consequences of our actions stops us from doing stupid things that could cause us our lives. Fear of burning ourselves stops us from jumping into a bonfire. But the Bible also says that the fear of man is a snare, a trap. We must teach our kids to fear the right things in life and in doing so, face the right fears boldly.

"Mum, did I sin when I watched that movie?" "Mum, I said this to my friend, is God displeased?" "I want God to know I love Him, Mum." I love to hear my kids being concerned about what God thinks and how He feels about their actions. They are learning to fear God and live for His pleasure. We need to help our kids become God-conscious and not man-conscious.

A pure heart comes from embracing our emotions, acknowledging our weaknesses and having a heart that follows hard after God. Let's raise kids as God chasers, help them embrace their feelings and not shut them off or ignore them, and channel them in a way that brings God honour.

On Saturday, 31 August, seven married couples attended the Grace Marriage Course (PLEDGE) at the newly completed L4 Shalom at Grace@BukitBatok (GII). The marriage course was conducted by Vincent and Marie Ang who have known each other since they were teenagers and have been married for the past 25 years. The full-day course started at 10am with a break for lunch and finished at 5pm, just in time for the Saturday evening service.

The Grace Marriage Course was missional in focus and there were two pre-believing couples who had signed up for the course. These couples invested a day of their weekend to improve their relationships and wanted to know more about becoming a better spouse to each other.

The PLEDGE programme covers essential topics such as purpose, love, relationship, communication, emotional connection and setting couple goals. Couples gained useful knowledge about love and respect, the 5 Love Languages, building intimacy, and conflict resolution. They also learned about God's plan for their marriage and key biblical principles to support and bring alignment to their lives as One.

The couples engaged in deep meaningful conversations with each other to talk about sensitive topics as well as share general insights, experiences and wisdom with the other participants. Everyone, including the facilitators, learnt something new in order to improve their own marriages through this dynamic and open interaction.

The day culminated in an emotional bonding time with one another, pledges of love and commitment and a beautiful renewal of marriage vows conducted by Pastor Benjamin Wong.

GRACE PRISON MINISTRY VOLUNTEER — MY PERSONAL JOURNEY

I was recruited into Grace Prison Ministry (GPM) more than 12 years ago. At that time, by the grace of God, I had just received a reprieve from a life-threatening illness. To fulfill my thanksgiving promise to the Lord to serve Him wherever He sends me, I signed up for the Prison Ministry, not knowing what it entails.

I was previously a Sunday Christian and have never served in any ministry. Had I been approached to join GPM through any other ways than through my promise, I would probably have refused, believing that I was not up to it. And I was actually not up to it—I was shy, weak in bible knowledge, scared to speak in public, and lacking in so many ways. The only thing I had of any use was my willingness to serve. To the Lord, it was enough. He provided all that was necessary. Looking back today, I find the transformation in me through serving quite astonishing; our Lord is truly more powerful than we can imagine.

Serving in GPM has brought me to meet people from different walks of life. In my eyes, before joining GPM, prisoners are dangerous people who should be avoided if possible. They are people who will rob or steal from me if I give them a chance, even after they have served their sentences. Serving in GPM allows me to get to know many of the prisoners personally and I realise that they are not very different from myself. The biggest difference is that they are being punished for their sins while I am not. I am reminded that I am a sinner like them. Jesus had to die for my sins, just as He had to for theirs. My feelings towards the prisoners changed and I now regard them as my brothers and sisters whom I love dearly.

In learning about God's Word, the research that I did as part of my GPM duties showed me how little I really knew about what God is saying to me. It made me want to find out more. It made joining a bible study class acceptable to me (where it wasn't previously). The prisoners have a lot of free time and many of them actually become very well-versed in the bible. Some

of the questions they ask are quite deep. It made me become aware that as teachers of God's Word, we must prepare well, know it intimately and never let our guard down. We can only teach what is correct if we first learn it ourselves. Through all these, I get to further understand who God is and to grow in Him.

When I first joined GPM, I was not an outgoing person; in fact, I was quiet and shy. I had virtually no experience in leading or speaking to groups of people. I was very afraid of failure and rejection, but GPM gave me the opportunity to be a leader and speaker in the chapel services. Initially, I was often intimidated by my task, but God always gave me strength through the Holy Spirit, and through the support and encouragement of my fellow volunteers. Little by little, experience built up and in time, I grew to realise that it is a great honour to have been given this opportunity to share God's Word with others. It became not a challenge but a blessing to me. Today, I thank God for that opportunity to grow not only spiritually but also to develop into a more all-rounded person. GPM gives its volunteers opportunities in leadership and public speaking which few other ministries can offer.

I stepped down from GPM last year after more than 11 years, due to family commitments. As I look back, I consider serving in GPM an honour, a great privilege, and a blessing. Even though I no longer join the volunteers in Changi Prison, I still stay in touch and my heart still goes with them. I sometimes meet brothers I got to know when they were serving their time in prison. Although some still face many difficulties, many have reintegrated well into society and now attend church regularly. With the power of God, they have turned their lives around by rejecting sin and its path to destruction. It makes me glad and thankful when I think GPM has possibly played a small part in it. All praise to God!

The world is getting smaller and it is getting increasingly easier for people to uproot from their own homelands to find better jobs in other countries. As we all know, Singapore is blessed beyond measure; with an uncorrupted government body and a comparatively strong economy, Singapore seems to be the Promised Land for many. It is no wonder we have people from many different nations living in this tiny island. According to the Ministry of Manpower, as of 2018, the total foreign workforce in Singapore amounts to 1,386,000. That's equivalent to 1,630 Olympic-sized swimming pools filled with human beings!

Therefore, with all due respect, can I just say, "Wake up, Singapore!" Since there are possibly 1,386,000 human souls drowning in 1,630 swimming pools of darkness!

Grace Missions started our local missions project in March 2019. Through offering community services such as Traditional Chinese Medicine and physiotherapy services, English and computer classes, as well as special events, the ultimate aim of this ministry is to reach out to the migrant workers from various nations with the gospel of Christ. It can be highly impactful, especially when they take the gospel back to their homelands. But we need more volunteers in local missions and we need you! Here are 3 reasons why you should join us:

1. God says to love the foreigner residing in our land.

Leviticus 19:33-34 (NIV) says, "When a foreigner resides among you in your land, do not mistreat them. The foreigner residing among you must be treated as your native-born. Love them as yourself, for you were foreigners in Egypt. I am the Lord your God."

2. Whatever we do for these people, we do it for God.

Matthew 25:40 says, "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'" When we think of this verse, we think of the poor people in third-world countries. What if I tell you that we have many in our own land? Let's face it: it's not easy leaving your home to start a life in a foreign land. What more having to adapt to life as someone of low social status? If we're honest, we place our migrant construction workers and foreign domestic helpers in the 'low social status' box. Imagine how that would make them feel. And is that God's intention for them? So get up close to a migrant worker and befriend them, listen to what they need, and love them into the Kingdom of God.

3. Preach the gospel to the world, here in Singapore!

Mark 16:15 says, "Go into all the world and preach the gospel to all creation." Well, isn't the world right here? In Singapore, we have people from Sri Lanka, India, Bangladesh, Myanmar, Philippines, Vietnam, China, Africa, Israel, Indonesia, Cambodia, and many more! Singapore is literally an Antioch!

恩典门训

每个信耶稣或跟随耶稣的人或门徒都知道大使命中的「使万民成为门徒」。西方有句谚语「魔鬼就在细节中」。简单解释：「原则我们同意，只是方法和细节就各有己见了」。
