

The list of things that we were grateful for, goes on.



New Things for 2021

At the first weekend English Service of 2021, Senior Pastor Wilson Teo shared about the general direction for Grace Assembly for this new year.

Titled “New Things”, the sharing was a continuation from what Pastor Wilson had preached at our 70th Anniversary Thanksgiving Service on 31 December 2020.

At the 70th Anniversary Thanksgiving Service, Pastor Wilson shared of Isaiah 43:16–19 (ESV). These verses showed that God’s Word to Israel was never to limit God to the past, but to look forward to the new things that God would do among them. And these new things may happen suddenly and unexpectedly.

At Grace Assembly, we are thankful to God for His faithfulness over the church for the past 70 years -- for the past godly leaders and members who gave of their lives and finances so that Grace Assembly can have our two buildings at Tanglin and Bukit Batok.

However, we should not let ourselves dwell in past achievements and forget that God is doing a new thing among us. All that God has done in the last 70 years for Grace Assembly is only a beginning. We should not limit ourselves to just these two buildings that God has blessed us. There is so much more that God wants to do in and through this local church.

That was why Pastor Wilson felt that God has chosen Grace Assembly to be the largest religious cluster of Covid-19 infected cases last year. It was probably God’s way of shaking us out of our comfort zone, and He scattered us all over Singapore so that we could wait upon Him for the new things that He wanted to do among us.

Pastor Wilson reminded the congregation that during the pandemic period, God showed us that Grace Assembly was not just about the buildings we own. It is about God’s people, a living local community, who share a common discipleship experience of doing life together. When we could not meet in our buildings, God built us up spiritually with Him and relationally with each other when we banded together to overcome our challenges and difficulties.

God revealed to us the critical need to adopt digital technology for our classes, our services, and many other discipleship areas. God has used this pandemic to prepare us for any crisis that will happen in the future whereby Grace Assembly can function with, or without a building.

Pastor Wilson continued to share about the following areas which represent three out of our five strategic pillars, that we need to strengthen, for Grace Assembly to arise stronger than before, from this pandemic experience.

1. Discipleship

Throughout the pandemic last year, we saw a very healthy take-up rate of online classes, ranging from Alpha Course, Membership Class, Restore to Wholeness, and many others that went online.

From the attendance and engagement, it was evident that Gracians and new visitors are very keen on online classes, given the ease of attending one.

This is a new thing that God has accelerated through the pandemic. Given the positive response and feedback, we will be offering more online classes in the coming days. Pastor Wilson also expressed his desire to see all our Grace Discipleship Institute (GDI) classes to be held both online and on-site in the days ahead.

Another area of focus under Discipleship will be on small groups.

Our small groups have been one of the key pillars that kept our faith community intact during this challenging time when we could not meet on-site for relational engagements.

Pastor Wilson expressed his appreciation to the small group leaders who gave their best to facilitate and connect with every member, relationally and spiritually, during this difficult time. This faith community had allowed everyone to remain relationally connected to God, and to one another, and to spur each other on, especially in difficult seasons.

This reinforced Pastor Wilson’s belief that being part of a small group is necessary for every believer and not just something good to have when one has time.

As such, there will be greater emphasis on the small group ministry in Grace Assembly, which is vital in ensuring the continuity of the church whenever we cannot gather in our buildings.

Moving forward, small groups will become one of the key platforms for Gracians to be disciplined according to the Grace Discipleship Framework.

Pastor Wilson also added that discipleship within the family is another important area. During the circuit breaker period when churches were closed, many parents had to step up to be the Children and Youth ministers to their kids. In this process, God was doing a new thing – He has started to restore faith discipleship to parents, who are the spiritual headship of the family.

God has used a pandemic to show us that church buildings can be closed, but the basic unit of the family remains. The faith of the family in Christ can remain strong even without a church building. Pastor Wilson urged parents to arise to take back what rightfully belongs to them as the spiritual headship of their families. This is a significant shift from the old thinking that the church was the main discipler of their children. In the days ahead, the church will be sharing more with parents on strategies in partnering and empowering them to fulfil this critical role to disciple their children.

2. Community Outreach

Community Outreach refers to believers being the salt and light in the community where we reach out to the needy such as the widows, the orphans, and the foreigners among us.

The intent is not to get people saved as the primary motivation.

The purpose is to be a blessing to the community because everyone is created in God's image - believers and pre-believers.

Pastor Wilson went on to explain that the church blesses and helps the needy because they are fellow imagers of God who have a real need in their lives. As God's people, we must reach out to the least, the lost, and the lonely, who require tangible help.

He also shared how Grace Assembly has blessed the community in 2020 through various activities and platforms, despite the pandemic and the restrictions.

Moving forward, Grace Assembly wants to remain relevant to the needs of the community. The church plans to start a centre to allow believers to donate food, clothing, and other necessities to bless the needy. It is also

exploring to partner with tuition agencies to provide low-cost subsidised tuition for needy students within our church premises. Not only do we want to meet the needs of the poor, but we also hope to alleviate poverty by helping needy families' children to break out of poverty through education.

3. Missions

Through Grace Missions, we are now involved with 12 nations through planting churches, preparing leaders, and propelling people. Through the pandemic, God has shown us again that the needs in the nations are very plentiful. While Singapore has a substantial financial reserve to keep the nation going, many countries do not.

As a nation blessed by God, Pastor Wilson emphasised that we must do our part to see the gospel preached and the Body of Christ strengthened in the nations.

During the pandemic, country borders were closed. However, this did not stop us from evolving to use online technologies to continue our missions work. Our current missions' strategies have served us well for the last ten years. However, God has revealed to us the need to review our Grace Missions' strategies for the future, to ensure that they will be relevant for the post-pandemic world.

Ending off the vision casting sermon with a prayer, Pastor Wilson dedicated Grace Assembly to the Lord in 2021, asking that His Kingdom come, and His will be done in this local church of Grace Assembly.

Thousands **DISPLACED** in Cambodia floods

Since the beginning of October 2020, multiple tropical storms that have crossed into Cambodia caused widespread flooding across 19 provinces.

As of 28 October 2020, at least 42 people have died. The floods have affected 2 million people with 800,000 people directly and negatively impacted. Of these, approximately 388,000 people with pre-existing vulnerabilities prior to the disaster are in need of major humanitarian assistance. The most severely affected provinces are Battambang, Banteay Meanchey, Pursat, Kampong Speu and Kampong Thom in central and western Cambodia.

More than 161,500 houses have been damaged and some 14,300 households were evacuated to safe sites, evacuation centres, while others are sheltered in tents or plastic sheets.

Grace Missions has committed to providing disaster-relief aid for flood victims through our missions partner New Hope Church in Pursat. The church has used the funds to purchase essential items and together with the government, they have started distributing food packages to affected families.

Let us lift up Cambodia in prayer. Please pray for the following:

- Evacuees to have access to clean water, sanitation facilities and hygiene items, food especially for children under five. They also need essential items like mosquito nets, blankets and tarpaulins, access to education supplies and temporary learning spaces, and assistance to restart livelihood activities.
- Safe delivery of assistance to affected families as roads and bridges have been damaged. Over 175,000 households have had their livelihoods

impacted and 329,000 hectares of agricultural land has been damaged. 89,152 of the most vulnerable households across 14 provinces require food assistance and livelihoods recovery support.

- health care facilities and hospitals to be able to function again.
- welfare of 1,640 children in 48 residential care institutions
- welfare of prison inmates. Population of two prisons were relocated, resulting in overcrowding in the prisons.
- Swift and safe removal of unexploded ordnance

Cambodia is one of the most affected countries in the world, with landmines, cluster munitions and other unexploded weapons. The floods could have dislodged unexploded ordnance (UXO) and landmines. Efforts to safely remove them is being hampered due to the inaccessibility of some areas. There have been five requests for UXO removal thus far.

- COVID-19 outbreak to be well-controlled. There has been a surge of community cases. Further support is needed to scale up the response, including immediate humanitarian assistance as well as longer term support to restore access to basic services and rebuild the livelihoods of affected people.

Grace Missions has reached out to 1,100 affected families. We continue to give assistance to the churches affected so that both the church and their communities of pre-believers would be blessed.

The church has used the funds to purchase essential items and together with the government, they have started distributing food packages to affected families.

A Course for the **OPPORTUNE MOMENT** (KAIROS)

Grace Assembly conducted its 5th run of the KAIROS Course from 13 September to 8 November 2020. Due to the COVID-19 restrictions about physical gatherings, the KAIROS Course was conducted online via the ZOOM platform by our own team of 15 facilitators. Sessions were conducted every Sunday from 2pm to 4pm. 24 participants completed the full course and graduated on 8 November 2020.

Throughout the course, the participants showed great motivation and enthusiasm. Many were touched in ways they did not expect.

KAIROS is a foundational course on world Christian missions. It brings out God's heart for all the nations of the world and His desire to use His people to be a blessing to them. KAIROS emphasises the importance of ministering to cultures that still have few or no indigenous churches.

KAIROS... brings out God's heart for all the nations of the world and His desire to use His people to be a blessing to them.

KAIROS is designed to educate, inspire and challenge Christians to meaningful participation in God's heart for all the nations. It is a tool God is using to help transform the worldview of believers, so they see themselves as having been blessed in order to be a blessing to all people groups.

KAIROS is a nine-session course that covers four major areas:

- Biblical – We discover that missions lies at the centre of God's concern and that an overriding theme throughout the whole Bible is God blessing His people to be a blessing to all people groups.
- Historical – God's missions purpose can be seen throughout history. We gain much from studying the past successes and failures of the church in the area of missions expansion.
- Strategic – We learn about strategy and key missions strategies that bear fruit in reaching unreached people groups in today's world. Every believer and church have a significant role to play.
- Cultural – Missions involves crossing cultures. We learn what culture is and see what it takes to communicate and make disciples in a culture different from our own.

KAIROS uses a variety of learning methods and activities such as:

- Devotional Teaching
- Prayer for Least Reached People
- Introductions to Readings
- Video Teachings
- Readings
- Worksheets
- Small Group Interaction
- Special Cultural Activities

The following are some excerpts of their takeaways from the KAIROS Course:

“I have always been a short-term missions goer. But after attending KAIROS, I realised there was so much for me to learn. I need to keep the vision by learning more about the cultures of the least reached people (LRP) and praying for them. It is more important to have real compassion for these LRPs than just simply going for short-term missions trips. Reaching out to the lost should be integral in all Christians, not just for missions-minded Christians.” – Sandy Low

“I have a good understanding about God’s business which is to win the world; the challenges faced, the strategies to deploy and what role I can play in this mission.” – David Chung

Overcoming Befriending CHALLENGES in times of Crisis

“It is a land the LORD your God cares for; the eyes of the LORD your God are continually on it from the beginning of the year to its end.”
—Deuteronomy 11:12

Like a long-drawn out storm, the COVID-19 pandemic hit us all, and brought on massive disruption to all the services we offered to our beneficiaries.

With the exception of our Senior Centres which remained operational on-site, all our other centres were shut during the Circuit Breaker. However, staff from REACH Community Services continued to serve our clients remotely, operating from their own homes.

The Community Befriending Programme (CBP) was the worst hit, with both the Befrienders and Befriendees impacted. As part of the safe-distancing restrictions, the Befrienders, many of whom are also seniors themselves, had to stop visiting the vulnerable and isolated senior Befriendees and were confined to their own homes. Without fellowship and interaction, the lack of social interaction meant that the senior Befrienders themselves suffered from loneliness and isolation. Clearly, landline phones alone—which most seniors have at home—are inadequate to overcome isolation. The most vulnerable group also became the most disadvantaged.

The urgency to create more platforms to connect with the seniors was apparent. This called for prompt action in searching for additional platforms for engagement, which led to online platforms such as Zoom, WhatsApp video calls and Facebook being used to execute the Befriending Programme.

Hence, the “Tele-Befriender Programme” was conceived in May 2020.

An intentional programme was rapidly put together to equip our seniors with smartphones provided by CareLine, and simultaneously train them to use software or equipment to network with others.

Initially, both the volunteer Befrienders and senior Befriendees were resistant. God our Jehovah-Jireh nonetheless provided us a committed Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) partner who was able to mobilise a large number of dedicated volunteers who were equipped with the technical knowledge and people skills, and were eventually successful in reaching out to our senior Befriendees.

Through the 10-week engagement period, 28 seniors were touched by these volunteers. Furthermore, most of the volunteers have continued befriending our seniors even when the commitment period was over.

Through this experience, many volunteers were also motivated to stay constantly connected with their own aged parents. Despite it not being our intention to educate the volunteers about the need to spend time with their aged parents, the rippling effect of this befriending effort could possibly be God’s plan to draw children closer to their ageing parents.

While the staff were busy adapting to the changes and meeting the increasing demands of community support as a result of COVID-19, volunteers played a significant role in filling the gaps by being the extra hands and legs in reaching out to the vulnerable. Volunteers are part of REACH’s heartbeat.

This year, in total, we reached out to 145 beneficiaries in both the Bukit Gombak and Telok Blangah communities. It was heart-warming to witness the beneficiaries breaking into smiles when they received the gifts over from our little ones’ hands. This year, the gift was either a blanket or towels. We hoped to bring across the message that we are covering them with prayers this Christmas. Besides the purchased gift, in the gift pack were cute hand-made cards done by our children together with a 1kg rice pack as well as masks sponsored by GCO. Upon collection of the rice and masks, families then went on their way to personally hand over the gifts to the beneficiaries.

Due to COVID-19, there were various restrictions which caused many inconveniences for the project. However, we are proud of the 142 participating families for stepping out of their comfort zone to spread the joy of Christmas in a very special way this year. Similarly, we are thankful for the 16 Grace Kids leaders who volunteered and laboured in this project as well as for the support parents rendered to make this project achievable for our little ones and, a success.





Worshippers this Christmas found their normal celebrations curtailed. Recorded carols, preaching, performances and greetings were all done online. We call this the “new normal” during this pandemic season. The kids magnanimously demonstrated their gifting with their recorded rendition of “Tell the World of His Love”. We were grateful for the gift of technology which made all these possible.

Sis Ynel Hizon, Bro Darwin and Sis Den Joaquin shared their testimonies on how the Lord powerfully displayed His glory in their lives during the pandemic season. Sis Ynel, who was left jobless for nine months, was sustained by the Lord in staying in Singapore on a social visit pass for almost a year. She experienced multiple rejections in her job applications. She and her husband continued to trust the Lord and held on to Jeremiah 29:11's promise. The Lord answered and she started her new job on 17 November 2020.

Darwin and Den, who have been preparing for their wedding for almost a year, were challenged to resume the celebration due to the pandemic. The Lord used their friend and spiritual mentors to lead and guide them on how they could push through their marriage in Singapore, and they were solemnised on 29 June 2020. Den shared how she was given strength by the Lord as she faced her single motherhood journey and found her true love. She also pointed out that God's plans are better than ours and held on to Romans 8:28 that we just need to put our full trust in the Lord, and He is in control.

Pastor Rosita Cristobal unwrapped the key message within the One True Light theme aligned to the big idea, "Celebrate the One True Light, the One that enlightens everyone — Jesus Christ". Handwritten letters from inmates, NTUC gift cards and goodie packs were personally delivered by Gracian volunteers to 69 inmates' families all over Singapore, with messages of hope, peace and reconciliation. Praise be to God!

went down to the house to see if she was home. Thank God we managed to connect with her and were privileged to hear her story. As the recipient is a Christian, she asked us about our church services and we also took the opportunity to pray with her."

We praise God also for Grace Missional Group (GMG) that have risen in such a time as this and wanting to bless the community out of their own initiative. CCK Covenant was one such GMGs! In partnership with the PFS Care Club which reaches out to children of those incarcerated via weekend tuition, the members packed and prepared Christmas goodie packs, which contained personally written Christmas cards, children's bibles and specially requested gifts, for 23 children.

We are indeed encouraged by the spirit of giving (of time, prayers and gifts) amongst Gracians to bring Christ's love and hope to families of those incarcerated. Christ is truly the reason for the season!

After leaving my job in 2018, I attended Bible school for two years and was seeking the Lord's direction on my next steps after my graduation in 2021. The 9-month Grace Apprenticeship Programme (GAP) internship programme at Grace Assembly of God presented itself as a timely and opportune platform to expose myself to the workings of church ministry and to discern my calling with the counsel of the church. Although joining this programme at this juncture meant taking a pause from my full-time studies, I thought there was no better time to explore and experience a reimagined ministry in the midst of the unprecedented crisis of COVID-19. The Grace Discipleship FRAMEWORK (GDF) – Part 2

Our church vision motto: “More People, More Like Jesus” succinctly captures the call and reason of existence for every church, Grace Assembly included. It contains our two core activities – evangelism, the sharing of the Gospel with the aim of helping people come into God’s Kingdom, and discipleship, the journey of Christlikeness for those who have entered into His Kingdom.

Pastor Wilson has given the definition of Discipleship as “the process of becoming like Jesus Christ in every area of one’s being.” This is all-encompassing and comprehensive.

Jesus Christ is to be the centre, the standard, the model, the motivation, the reason and the endpoint for our discipleship. It is not about us or what we do; it is about Him and how we are becoming like Him.

“The student is not above the teacher, but everyone who is fully trained will be like their teacher (Luke 6:40; NIV).”

The effectiveness of our Discipleship Framework is measured against how enabled we are to become more and more like Christ, our Lord and Saviour.

This is a **process**, which means that on this side of heaven, we will not finish becoming like Christ.

“For this very reason, make every effort to add to your faith goodness; and to goodness, knowledge; and to knowledge, self-control; and to self-control, perseverance;

and to perseverance, godliness; and to godliness, mutual affection; and to mutual affection, love. For if you possess these qualities in increasing measure, they will keep you from being ineffective and unproductive in your knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ (2 Peter 1:5 – 8; NIV).”

As Peter exhorts us, as long as we make every effort to keep adding His virtues to our lives, we will not be unproductive and ineffective in becoming like Christ. Progress, rather than perfection, is expected.

The extent of this becoming like Jesus Christ is in **every area of one’s being**. In the private, the public, the family, the workplace, the home, and the marketplace, our becoming like Jesus Christ must be evident. This 360° Discipleship requires us to come up with a holistic approach.

To address all these aspects of discipleship, we have three tracks, of which the core is termed “The Disciple-Maker Track”. This core track is for every Gracian.

We began by asking how we are to assess the holistic development of a disciple. The typical discipleship program creates classes with the appropriate content and environment that are geared towards the envisioned change and growth. While Scriptural and Spirit-led content and teaching are powerful as foundation for discipleship, they nurture only one aspect and not ‘every area’.

Hence, we came up with an assessment in the Five Key Growth Areas, which cover the whole development of a person, and couched in simple and easy-to-translate verbs:

1. KNOW

Sound, true and right knowledge is a vital starting point. Jesus is the Word and He reveals the Godhead through the Scriptures. It is this ongoing quantitative and qualitative engaging with God’s Word, through personal Bible reading, courses, classes, seminars and Bible studies that builds a biblical worldview in understanding God’s purpose and mission for us, and who we are in Him; including our identity, beliefs, character and attitudes. So instead of asking how many classes we have attended, which may or may not be an accurate indicator, we ask, “*How are we growing in God’s Word?*”


2. WALK

Cognitive development, though, essential, is inadequate because “knowledge puffs up (1 Corinthians 8:1b)”. It is not the hearing of the Word but putting the Word into practice that is commended (James 1:22). The Word of God should translate into spiritual disciplines, real-life application, and empower our day-to-day interactions, behavioural change and habit formation. The point of interest is, “*How is our walk with God?*”

These first two pertain to our personal growth and development as disciples.

3. RELATE

To know that we are loved by God and to love Him in return is very fulfilling but the greatest commandments according to Jesus is not just loving God (the vertical relationship) but loving people as well (the horizontal counterpart). Disciples must go beyond self-care and self-preservation to caring for the family of God, from personal expressions of faith to corporate, and from being individual-focused to community-focused. Relational discipleship consists of small groups where spiritual mentors and spiritual parenting is in place to impart Christian values and biblical principles life-on-life. While our love of God must be our primary motivation, here we want to consider, *"How is our love for people?"*

4. SERVE

Under the leadership of the Holy Spirit we want to discern and discover the gifts that He has given to the Body of Christ. This gives us our roles in the Body – areas where our gifts come into play in edifying the church of God. Under Christ's Headship we all have an important part in ministering together. As we have freely received, so we freely give and offer our worshipful service. We need to ask, *"How are we contributing to the Body of Christ?"* Our service is an important gauge of our growth as disciples of Christ.

5. SHARE

The members of a church exist to bless those who are outside the Church. We are to be Christ's witnesses to those who are beyond the walls of our premises. As Christ's ambassadors, we are translated from

being of the world into God's Kingdom and to be sent back from the Kingdom into the world. In this sense, everyone is either a missionary or a mission-field! Every disciple must have an outlet and an output of being and sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ to pre-believers; first, to those in our household, then to those at our workplace, community and the nations. The success of discipleship is not in the number of years but in the number of people, family members, and acquaintances we have the privilege and opportunity to share: *"How are we sharing God's love with others?"*

With these five areas one can determine if one is growing healthily or in a lopsided fashion. Only healthy disciples can be strong and able disciple-makers, who in turn, produce healthy and balanced disciples.



LOVING one another... **CARING** for one another

“Let His Love be perfected in us..” 1 John 4:12

How can I help someone struggling with problems affecting their mental well-being?

How do I help a family member who is a pre-believer and may be suffering from depression?

To what extent can I help the person? What are the limits...so that I do not support her in a way that is unsustainable?

These were questions raised by some Next-Gen leaders in Grace. Emotional and mental health issues apply to all life stages many of us can relate to these questions.

Do you know of a Gracian going through a prolonged period of crisis? You want to help but you do not know how to start. You noticed someone not behaving her usual self, in a depressed state, needing help. Is there someone in church that you can refer her to for help?

In view of the growing needs of the church faced by our leaders, a team of volunteer counsellors and pastoral carers from our Counselling and Pastoral Care Ministry (CPCM) came together to organise a training programme to equip them with basic counselling skills and practical handles in helping troubled teens and those with mental condition such as depression. The inaugural training was held on 11 and 18 November 2020. Some of the takeaways from the training were the understanding of a biblical counselling approach, using active listening skills, observing boundaries in helping, identifying those in need and making referrals. Here are some testimonies from the Next-Gen leaders who benefited from the training and the team of trainers from CPCM:

I volunteered to serve in this ministry. Training is on-going, so is walking alongside those in need of a listening ear and care. As I’m new to this role and I’m still learning and there are challenges, but God doesn’t call the qualified, He qualifies the called to be His hands and feet!” - **Sian**

COUPLE Discipleship Programme

To all dating couples and single Gracians looking to start dating, how prepared are you when you step into the world of dating, courtship and eventually marriage? Do you have couple mentors to walk with you in this initial phase of your journey? Have you invested in books, attended courses on subjects like understanding gender differences, couple communication, handling conflicts, boundaries in dating, remaining pure until you are married and understanding how your family of origin will affect how you relate to each other?

Welcome to the world of dating, courtship, and eventually marriage! When a man and a woman decide to take this initial path to know each other and evaluate if they are suitable for each other, they are embarking on the initial stage of the second most important decision of their lives!

The most important decision in one's life is to decide where and how you will spend eternity. Accepting Jesus Christ as your Lord and Saviour means choosing to live a life set apart for God and growing in Christ-likeness and Christ-centeredness in every part of our lives.

The second most important decision is probably the selection of one's spouse. This person that you choose will be spending the rest of his/her life with you till death do you part. This person will be with you, be involved in your life's decisions; sleep and wake up with you every day and if the Lord blesses, he or she will become the parent of your children. Hence, it is of utmost importance to take this decision very seriously.

Following up from the YAYP relationship sermon series where Nexus/YAYP organised a Zoom meet-up of dating couples with some married couples as shown on photo, YAYP will be starting this new Couple Discipleship Programme (CDP). The common practice in forming this relationship is broken into three phases: Dating, Courtship and Pre-Marriage:

Dating Phase – This first phase normally takes about 3-6 months with the couple getting to know each other and eventually deciding if they would like to take the relationship to the courtship phase as boyfriend/ girlfriend. Generally, it is advisable not to start this phase unless the couple is ready to get married within the next 5 years.

Courtship Phase – This next phase along the 5-year timeline allows a couple to gain a deeper understanding of each other with the intention to progress towards engagement and marriage. Some couples may take 2 years and some longer.

Pre-Marriage Phase – This final phase is when a couple is engaged and starts to plan for their wedding ceremony and married life. Couples



in this phase would likely be attending or attended the Marriage Preparation Discipleship Programme (MPDP). Couples can also consider signing up to attend MPDP at anytime during the courtship phase. MPDP is a 4-5 months course on a 2 weekly basis before couples get married followed by another 2 sessions during the first year of marriage.

The Couple Discipleship Programme (CDP) will cover the first 2 phases of the relationship for you and your partner. Upon entering the Courtship phase, we will assign a married couple to be your mentors. These couple mentors will be available to engage and support you and partner in your relationship on a monthly basis.

YAYP and FLM are pleased to bring you this exciting programme to prepare both singles and couples so that you can be better informed and receive the guidance that you need. Married Couple Mentors will walk with you on this journey before you sign up for MPDP.

My Spiritual **ENCOUNTER** During J333

This is a testimony of my baptism of the Holy Spirit during a J333 session on 7 October:

On the night prior to J333, I reconsidered attending it as my husband was not well physically, my eldest daughter, Sarah, came home late from CCA at around 7.25pm, and my youngest, Rebecca, was having exam stress. We started to have dinner only at 7.35pm. By the grace of God, I made it at 8.05pm, flustered. As I quietened down my soul and closed my eyes, and tried to be still before the Lord, I heard a still, small voice that said, “Do you love Me?” I didn’t respond immediately and remained silent. Moments later, I heard the voice again, saying, “Do you love Me?” It was then that my tears just flowed. I realised that I had been occupied with trivial concerns, such as having dinner with my family. I was convicted and began to ask God for forgiveness.

That night, J333 was led by Pastor Peter Lim and he encouraged those who wished to receive the baptism of the Holy Spirit. He led with the song “Fall” by Hillsong United. The message was “relax, receive and respond.” He invited those who wanted to receive to sing the chorus:

*Holy Spirit come in power
Change my heart
I want to live for You, my God
Let Your Spirit come in power
Change my life
That I may live for you, my Lord
Fall on us Lord*

I wanted to receive His love as I had been struggling with my wish to speak in tongues for a few months already, uttering monosyllables with little progress and disappointment. I felt that hearing His still, small voice, or seeing visions and dreams were easier for me than speaking in tongues. This could have been because I came from a Baptist church previously.

I relaxed and closed my eyes as the chorus played. Suddenly, I sensed a gust of wind, something descended upon me, tears just rolled down my cheeks, my tongue was loosened and I started to utter in angelic tongues, while my right hand started to shake uncontrollably. Yet, it was a peaceful feeling. It was then that I realised that I had a spiritual encounter receiving the baptism of the Holy Spirit. Praise God! I even remember the exact time it happened—8.33pm.

I learnt that sometimes we fixate too much on our current situation and use that to determine the outcome. But God turned it around. I almost did not attend J333 that day and could have missed this powerful encounter! If only we can be still before Him, and hear what He has to say to each one of us...




Healing of frozen shoulder

Mum's SALVATION

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My mother had been a staunch Buddhist/Taoist all her life. And for most of her life, she has often been gripped by fear and superstition. Over the past four years, my mother experienced many health problems. She had multiple falls, which resulted in fractures to her knee, hip and back. In early 2020, she also began kidney dialysis and was often in and out of the hospital.

Because of her condition, I decided to use every opportunity to share about my faith with her. I would encourage her to call upon the name of Jesus whenever she was anxious, fearful or in pain. I also constantly shared Isaiah 41:13, "For I am the LORD your God, who takes hold of your right hand and says to you, Do not fear; I will help you."

On 24 August 2020, while my mother was waiting to be admitted to the hospital for shortness of breath and severe back pain, she told me that she had decided to follow Jesus and I seized the opportunity to lead her in the sinner's prayer with my limited Hokkien. I thank God for His gift of salvation that led my mother to call His name and be saved.

Over the next two months, my mother's health worsened. An MRI revealed that she had a degenerative lumbar spine which was pressing on a nerve. This caused her to experience constant pain and numbness in her limbs, and she could not sleep well. In November, my mother's condition deteriorated to a point where the doctor told us there was nothing much we could do to relieve her pain.

When she received the news, my mother decided to stop her dialysis as the pain she had to go through was unbearable. My brothers and I encouraged her to continue the treatments, but she wanted us to respect her final wish. So we reluctantly agreed and she began palliative care at home.

Those six weeks of home palliative care were the most precious and wonderful times we spent with our late, beloved mother. We saw how our Lord had granted her all the desires of her heart the moment she put her trust in Him. Firstly, she was baptised at home on the day she was discharged, in the presence of all her children.


Secondly, she was able to sleep through the night for eight hours without pain—despite not having slept well for four months due to constant pain, and needing medication every three hours for it. She even told us that she was not sleeping on earth, but was with Jesus in heaven. My mother also testified that she saw heaven and it was a beautiful place, with many homes and rooms. God showed her a glimpse of her room, which made me recall John 14:2–3, "My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you? And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am." This blessed assurance from God gave my mother confidence.

Thirdly, she bade farewell to relatives and friends calmly, without the fear of her imminent death. She declared and shared her new faith in Jesus, telling them she was unafraid despite her days being numbered, and that she knew where she would go after she passed on. She also told everyone not to be sad for her, but to be happy that she would be with our Lord Jesus in eternity forever.

Fourthly, we have never heard mum singing all our lives! Yet, after accepting Christ, she would listen to worship songs and sing aloud purely, with all her heart. Whenever she said Hallelujah, she would have a wide smile on her face, despite the pain and suffering she was going through. She was firmly assured in her faith and had no fear of death; only peace and readiness to meet our God. And God honoured her faith and received her home on 15 December, as she passed away peacefully in her sleep.

It is my privilege to share my testimony of God's grace in my mother's life after her conversion. God opened the eyes of her heart to meet Him and the Holy Spirit taught my mother to grow in the knowledge of Jesus day by day. She was so eager to learn how to pray, listen to sermons and worship God. Despite being a young Christian, she was filled with the spirit of wisdom and revelation of Jesus. She constantly testified about the goodness of God despite the circumstances. Even when she was physically in pain, she still raised a Hallelujah to praise Him. I saw transformation in her life, and how she moved from darkness to light; from the power of Satan to God. Despite her late conversion, God did not short-change her or let her miss out on aspects of Christian living. She was baptised, attended church once, a cell meeting over Zoom, listened to sermons and even worshipped online! God did exceedingly and abundantly more than she could ask for.

I thank God for His gift of salvation to my mother, and am comforted that she is with Him in heaven now. Ephesians 2:8–9 says, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from ourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast." All glory to Him, Hallelujah and praise the Lord!



My company has been trading Financial Futures and Options in listed Exchanges for close to a decade. At the start of the pandemic, in March 2020, things started going downhill. As the market became more volatile, Exchanges and brokers asked for higher margins to be placed for every trade. Equities, bonds, and even gold were sold off sharply, and crude oil went negative. Never in history have prices fluctuated so much.

In mid-March, our company conducted some trade which we were familiar with. But a week later, liquidity for the product suddenly dried up and the market went against our position. To cover for market losses and hold on to our position, we needed an additional US\$3 million.

In desperation, I approached our previous partners to see if they could help but was turned down by them. I felt so helpless and prayed fervently for the market to turn in my favour or for someone to come up with additional funds to bail us out. To make matters worse, I was tied up with helping my daughter, who was studying in the United Kingdom (UK), to book flights so she could return to Singapore before UK went into lockdown. Her flight was cancelled and we had to arrange alternatives. By God's grace, we managed to book the last seat on another flight so she could return safely to Singapore.

After settling my daughter's flight, I was still praying in the office when the Lord reminded me of an acquaintance whom I met in November 2019 at a brokers' event. He asked me then, if I was keen to invest for others, but I put that conversation on hold. With God's prompting, I decided to call him and told him about my company's situation. He then introduced a company to me that could take over our trades. So my company presented our strategies to them and they seemed interested, but asked for a day to revert. The next 24 hours passed by slowly, but I did not want to sound pushy and keep calling them. I could only pray and send out prayer requests to close friends for a favourable outcome. Listening to worship

songs while waiting anxiously helped me to take my mind off the situation, and I trusted and believed that God would be able to turn things around.

The call finally came at around 7pm on Sunday, 22 March. The company agreed to take over those trades, but needed a few days to channel funds into their account. Thank God, our broker granted us more time to manage the transition and agreed not to liquidate us yet. It was a great relief!


A bleak and stressful situation that almost ended in bankruptcy for my company turned out to be a blessing. That trade alone reaped a profit of US\$2.2 million for 1.5 months, and our net profit for the first half of 2020 was a new record for us. At first, it seemed that no help would arrive, but God opened doors, poured out His favour, and orchestrated the entire situation for good. Today, my company is out of the woods, our partnerships have grown stronger, and we even set up a new fintech company to provide trading solutions for traders.

Through this difficult time, I clung onto His promises, submitting my work and business to God, knowing that the battles I face are not mine but His as well. "Be still, and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." (Psalm 46:10) All glory to God!

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An Unexpected Time of Rest

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On 8 July 2020, I woke up with an unusually painful sore throat. My throat felt dry even when swallowing saliva, and lozenges did not help to soothe it at all. So I went to Parkway East Hospital at about 5pm. It was then that the doctor spotted a 1-cm lump at my neck. He told me an infection was causing the swelling, and advised that I should see an Ear, Nose and Throat (ENT) specialist if the pain and discomfort should persist. He then prescribed me antibiotics and painkillers, and sent me home. But my condition did not improve. At dinner, my throat was still painful when eating and I had difficulty swallowing food. I took some medicine and tried to sleep.

However, the swelling around my neck worsened at night. I kept choking on my saliva and felt my airway was blocked. I had to get up every hour through the night to spit out saliva, which looked like phlegm. The swelling also spread to my lower jaw and face. The next morning, the pain worsened and I felt breathless when talking. So I made an appointment to see an ENT at Changi General Hospital (CGH).

At CGH, a scope showed that a severe swelling and blockage had narrowed my airway. I needed emergency admission into the high dependency ward for treatment and monitoring. The doctor told me that if the swelling around my

neck had pus, I would also require an emergency operation.

I waited in an isolation ward as I was displaying symptoms similar to that of COVID-19. However, my swab test result was negative, and a CT scan showed that I had a severe throat infection instead. Thank God I sought treatment early, as any delay might have been fatal. Over the next two days, I reacted well to the medication and was finally discharged on 12 July.

I give thanks to how God had seen me through this 4-day ordeal—from the moment I sought treatment, to the ENT making special arrangements to see me, to the negative swab tests, the speed of healing, and how my body reacted well to the medications, with no side effects.

I thank Him also for an unexpected but much-welcomed time of rest since I was undergoing tremendous stress that year. In March, I was facing financial difficulties and my business almost folded. Jermane, my daughter, was trying to return home from Leeds, where she was studying, before the lockdown. Jermane and I, as well as April and Janelle (my two other daughters), also all had dengue fever before my throat infection happened. I am thankful to God that He saw us through this difficult time. Prayer had made things possible.

2021年之新事

在2021年第二周的华语主日崇拜中，赵克文主任牧师分享了恩典堂在这新的一年的总体方向。

赵牧师以“新事”作为他讲道的主题，延续了2020年12月31日他在70周年感恩聚会中分享的内容。

在70周年感恩聚会中，赵牧师分享了以赛亚书43:16-19（和合本）。这些经文让我们看到对以色列来说，神的话不是把神局限在过去，而是期待神在他们中间要做的新事，这些新事会出乎意料地发生。

我们感谢神在过去70年里对恩典堂的信实，要感谢那些属神的领袖和会友，他们摆上他们的生命和金钱，建造了位于东陵和武吉巴督的两座标志性的建筑。

但是，我们绝对不能停留在过去的成就却忘记神要在我们的当中做新事。神在过去70年里为恩典堂所成就的仅仅是个开始。我们不可以将我们自己局限在神赐给我们的这两座美好的建筑里。神在这间本地教会中还要成就更多的事。

这也是为什么赵牧师认为是神拣选了恩典堂在去年成为2019新冠病毒最大的感染群。这是神撼动我们离开我们的舒适区的方法，祂将我们分散在新加坡各处，让我们可以等候祂将要做的新的事，等候祂将要在我们中间成就的事。

赵牧师提醒会众，在整个疫情期间，神向我们展示了恩典堂的本质并不只是我们所拥有的建筑物。恩典堂关乎的是神的子民，关乎生活在本地的群体，一起体验相同的门训生活。虽然我们没有了实体有形的建筑，但是当我们一起胜过我们的挑战和困难的时候，我们与神一起建造了我们的属灵生命，并和彼此建立起了关系。

神使用这一场疫情让我们做好准备，为要应对未来可能发生的任何危机，无论是否有建筑，恩典堂都能发挥作用。

接着，赵牧师继续分享了以下包含了我们五个战略支柱所需要强化的三个方面，使恩典堂通过在疫情当中的经历的而得到提升。

1. 门训

在去年的疫情期间，我们举办了在线洗礼与转会课、天父的爱、圣经课程，以及其他在线课程。从出席率和参与度来看，我们的恩友与新朋友都有兴趣参加在线课程，上课方式也很便利。

这是神通过这场疫情加速成就的新事。由于大家的回应和反馈良好，我们将继续提供在线课程。赵牧师也希望以后恩典堂门训中心的所有课程都能够以在线和现场授课的两种方式进行。

另一个需要强化门训的将是我们的小组。

当我们没有现场聚会和交流的情况下，在这样充满挑战的时期，我们的小组是使我们在场疫情中维持我们信仰群体的关键支柱之一。

赵牧师向小组组长们表达了他的感谢，感谢他们在这特殊时期尽最大的努力来帮助并联系每一位组员，为小组成员提供关系和属灵上的支持。特别在这困难的时期，这个信仰的群体让每一个人继续与神、与彼此保持连结，彼此鞭策。

这也让赵牧师坚信每一位信徒都必须参加小组，而不是等有时间的时候去选择性参加的活动。

因此，当我们不能在我们的建筑里聚集的时候，我们会更加强调恩典堂的小组事工，这对于保证教会的持续运作是至关重要的。

在恩典门训中心的框架下，小组以后将是恩友受装备的一个重要平台。

赵牧师也提到家庭中的门训是另一个重要部分。阻断期间教会关闭的时候，家长就成为了他们的孩子的主要导师，去牧养他们。在这个过程中，神在家庭中做了新事—神已经开始恢复父母在信仰上的门训，他们是家庭中属灵的领导者。

神用疫情来告诉我们教会的建筑可以关闭，但家庭这一基本单位仍然存在。就算没有了教会的建筑物，每个家庭在基督里的信心仍然可以保持坚固。赵牧师鼓励家长们兴起并拿回原本属于家长的权柄，就是家庭属灵的领导者。这是与以前“教会是孩子主要的导师”这一观念的另一个重大转变。在未来的日子里，教会将与家长们分享更多一起配搭的策略，并赋予他们权力，实践在装备孩子上所扮演的一至关重要的角色。

2. 社区外展

社区外展指的是信徒在社区中是盐和光，要向当中有需要的人，如寡妇、孤儿和我们中间的客旅伸出援手。这个出发点的主要目的不是让人得到救恩。

它的目的是祝福社区，因为每一个人，无论他是否是信徒，他都是按照神的形象所造的。

赵牧师继续解释说，教会去祝福和帮助这些有需要的人是因为他们与我们一样有神的形象，他们在生活中有切实的需要。我们作为神的子民，必须伸出援手去帮助那些最需要帮助的人，那些迷失的人和孤独的人。

他分享说尽管2020年处于疫情和限制中，但恩典堂年仍然通过不同平台与活动去祝福社区。

恩典堂以后将继续满足社区的需要。教会计划建立一个中心，让信徒捐出食物、衣服和其他必需品来祝福有需要的

人。教会也在探索与补习机构合作的可能性，在我们的教会地点内为贫困学生提供学费津贴。我们不仅要满足贫困人士的需要，而且要通过教育帮助贫困家庭的孩子摆脱贫困。

3 差传

恩典差传通过建立教会、培训领袖和推动会众，我们现在已经与12个国家建立了关系。神借着疫情再次让我们看到，各个国家都有极大的需要。许多国家都无法像新加坡一样拥有大量的储备资金来维持国家的运作，但许多国家都没有。

作为神所赐福的国家，我们必须尽自己的一份力量，在列国中传扬福音，使各国中基督的身体得以坚固。

尽管各国在疫情期间停止了出入境，但这如无法阻止我们通过在线科技继续我们的宣教工作。我们现有的差传策略在过去十年发挥了很好的作用。但是，神让我们看到我们需要为了未来检讨现有策略，以确保这些策略将继续在在疫情后发挥作用。

赵牧师在最后以祷告结束了分享异象的证道，他祷告将恩典堂2021年交托给神，愿祂的国降临，祂的旨意成就在恩典堂。

恩典门训框架（二）

（门训框架 / GDF）

我们教会的异象：“更多人，更像耶稣”简洁涵盖教会存在的每一个原因和呼召，包括神召会恩典堂。它包含我们两项核心活动——布道，传福音使人进入神的天国，及门徒训练，使信徒成长更像耶稣的旅程。

赵克文牧师将门徒训练定义：兴起圣灵充满，爱神和爱人；在教会内外，塑造耶稣基督门徒的恩友。这是全面包括所有的。

耶稣基督是我们门训的中心、标准、榜样、动机和结果。焦点不是我们或我们做什么；是耶稣基督和我们如何更像祂。

“学生不能高过先生；凡学成了的不过和先生一样（路 6:40）。”

门训框架的效果是建在如果有效的更像基督，我们的救主来衡量的。

这是一个**过程**，意味我们今生是不可能完全像基督。

“5 正因这缘故，你们要分外地殷勤；有了信心，又要加上德行；有了德行，又要加上知识；6 有了知识，又要加上节制；有了节制，又要加上忍耐；有了忍耐，又要加上虔敬；7 有了虔敬，又要加上爱弟兄

的心；有了爱弟兄的心，又要加上爱众人的心。8 你们若充足地有这几样，就必使你们在认识我们的主耶稣基督上不至于闲懒不结果子了。”（彼后 1:5-8）

彼得劝诫，只要我们竭尽全力将祂的美德不断添加在我们的生命中，要像基督就不会徒劳无益。所以，我们期盼进步，不是要完美。

更像耶稣的范围是在**人的全方位**。在隐私，公开，家庭，工作场所，家庭和职场中，我们更像耶稣生命是显而易见的。这360度的门训要求我们提供一套全方位的方法。

为落实门训的需求，我们提出了三个轨道，其中的核心轨道被称为“门训之道”。这核心之道是每个恩友必经的。

首先，我们要了解该如何评估门训的整体发展。典型的门训课程会创建具有适当内容和环境的课程，以适应预期的变化和增长。但是，丰盛的内容和课堂内的培训虽然能满足门训的基础需要，它只能培养门徒的单一方面，而不是“全方位”。

因此，我们设计了五个关键成长领域的评估，涵盖门徒全方位成长过程，并用简单易懂的动词介绍：

1. 知识

正确，真实和适当的知识是至关重要的起点。耶稣是道，并借着真理启示神格。通过个人阅读圣经、课程、学习、研讨会和圣经研究，持续不断的定量和定性地与神的真理，建立圣经世界观，从而理解了神对我们的目的和使命以及我们在祂里面的身份。因此，门徒所参与的课程，有可能成为准确的指标，我们可问：“我们在神的真理成长的如何？”

2. 行为

认知上的成长虽然必要不可缺，但它还是不足，因为“知识是叫人自高自大（林前 8:1）”。值得表扬的不是听道，而是将道行出来（雅各书 1:22）。神的话应转化为属灵纪律，应用于现实生活，并增强我们的日常互动，行为改变和习惯的养成。目的是，“我们如何与神同行？”

前两题关乎我们成为门徒的成长和发展。

3. 关系

有了神爱我们的知识并能回馈神的爱是令人满意的，但是耶稣所托付我们的大诫命不仅是要爱神（神与人的关系），也要爱人（人与人的关系）。门徒必须超

越自我爱护，自我保护的范围；从个人信仰的表达达到群体生活，从个人中心到群体中心，来爱护神的家庭。

关系性的门训由小组组成，其中有属灵导师和属灵家长指导，以关系影响的指导基督教价值观和圣经原则。我们的出发点虽然是应为我们爱神，我们也要思考：“我们对人的爱又是如何？”

4. 事奉

在圣灵的带领下，我们要辨别和发掘神所赐予基督肢体的恩赐。使我们能发挥肢体部位的作用——使用我们的恩赐祝福神的

教会。在基督的领导下，我们有重要的职分一起事奉。我们既白白的领受，也该白白的奉献敬拜的事奉。我们的事奉是有效和重要的量器来评估门徒的成长的过程。我们需问：“我们如何为基督肢体做出贡献？”

5. 分享

教会的存在是为了祝福教会以外的人。我们需要向教会墙外的人见证基督的爱。作为基督的使者，我们是从世界被救赎进入神的天国，并从天国被差派到世界去。意味，每个人都是宣教士或宣教禾场！每个门徒都必须成为耶稣的口和手，与未信者分享福

音；首先，向我们的家人，然后向我们的同事，社区和万国。门训的成功不是年限，而是我们所分享的人数，家人和亲朋戚友，及机遇的人：“我们如何与人分享神的爱？”

有了这五个方面，我们可以确定每个信徒的成长是否偏斜正轨。只有健全的信徒才能成为健全有能力的门徒导师，借着他们又培训下一代的健全门徒。


